Level 1: Leading, tying quick release knot, grooming, feeding, caring for tack, feeding, deworming, natural gaits, safety rules.

Level 2: Bowline knot, proper tack fit, cooling out, parts of horse, parts of English and Western tack.

Level 3: Must schedule with Coordinator. Must have passed Levels 1 & 2 in a previous year. Demonstrate showmanship and horsemanship skills, keeping a horse healthy, hoof care.
