In lieu of payment, a <a href="scholarship application">scholarship application</a> should be turned for each youth who is requesting a scholarship to cover the State 4-H Participation Fee.

**Enrollment/re-enrollment deadlines:** Remember that youth can enroll in 4-H at any time, however, returning members planning to show 4-H projects at the 2020 Armada Fair must be enrolled by Nov. 1, 2019 and new members by April 1, 2020.
