Skillathon Regionals and State Championship Results

The first statewide Skillathon wrapped up with the Southeast Region event on March 20th. The Southeast region had the largest delegation of participation across the state, with Wayne County having the most 4-H members compete. What is the Skillathon? A comprehensive test of 4-H members knowledge about all things agriculture, especially livestock! Participants completed multiple choice questions in the areas of: Beef, Horses, Sheep, Swine, Dairy, Goats, Dogs, Rabbits, Poultry, and General Knowledge (Animal Care & Well-Being, Tools, Crops, Biosecurity, etc.).

Individuals scoring above the minimum percentile in each age division will receive an invitation to participate in the Michigan 4-H Skillathon State Championship. The State competition will take place April 10th.

All participants will receive a Skillathon T-Shirt. Members and Adults who progress to the State Competition with receive hoodies.

Approved 4-H activities in 2021

MSU Extension and Michigan 4-H professionals are working diligently to chart a path toward resuming in-person programming when it is safe to do so during the current public health crisis. Though it is premature to cite a specific date, no one is more eager than our own staff to resume events, club meetings, competitions, and fairs. Using guidance from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and the university, as well as the most current science available, we will modify all MSU Extension programming to adhere to public health standards at the federal, state, and local levels.

MSU Extension professionals have been thoughtfully creating guidelines that allow Michigan 4-H volunteers and members to conduct limited business while protecting public health. This information helps create a path forward with the eventual goal of in-person programming. To help inform volunteers and 4-H families of the most current guidelines, Michigan 4-H launched the Approved 4-H Activities in 2021 webpage. This website will be updated every two weeks or as soon as new information becomes available.

It is imperative that volunteers and 4-H'ers alike adhere to the current guidelines so we can continue to focus on community standards for eventual in-person events and programs. Apply for a 2021 4-H State Award!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.



State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards (13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member.



Important Thumb Jackpot Beef Show message to beef project members

Please read carefully below the information from the 4-H & FFA Thumb Jackpot Beef Program Committee regarding the annual jackpot show planned for April 17th in Imlay City.

As you are likely aware, face-to-face programming for Michigan State University Extension and Michigan 4-H has not been permitted since March 2020 due to Covid-19. While direction from Michigan State University regarding these restrictions has not changed yet, the Jackpot Show Committee is hopeful to see updated directives soon and is moving forward with plans for the 2021 show. Registration forms and information for the show are attached here along with a couple of educational contests that do not require a face-to-face experience. **Show and contest entries are due by April 2nd.**

Because of the uncertainty of the circumstances, the Jackpot Show Committee will reassess MSU's guidance on face-to-face programming on April 5th to determine if the show will be able to proceed as a 4-H sponsored event. If it is determined at that time MSU Extension 4-H programs are still not able to host face-to-face activities, or the plans for this event cannot be accommodated within the allowable directives of the MSU Community Compact (<u>https://msu.edu/together-we-will/msu-community-compact/</u>), a decision will be made to pivot this show to an open show hosted by the Paul DeLong Memorial Show Committee. The show rules will remain the same regardless if the host changes. If the show is not able to proceed as a 4-H event, families may choose to allow their children to participate as open exhibitors instead of 4-H members.

High school seniors who wish to apply for the Paul DeLong Memorial Scholarship must submit their application on the entry form for the Jackpot Show. For 2021 participation in the face-to-face show is not a requirement to apply for the scholarship. If a family chooses not to engage in face-to-face activities at this time, the scholarship applicant will not be penalized provided they meet all other requirements.

For those new to the beef project or who have not been involved in the 4-H & FFA Thumb Jackpot Beef Program (https://www.thumbjackpot.com/), it is an educational opportunity available to 4-H and FFA members in the seven counties of the thumb: Huron, Lapeer, Macomb, Oakland, Sanilac, St. Clair, and Tuscola. The committee annually hosts a jackpot show for beef exhibitors, provides educational programming, and awards scholarships to graduating seniors.

Changes to this year's program:

- New for this year we are offering a photo contest. Youth who enter both the essay and photo contest will be eligible for an overall contest prize.
- New for this year we will be selecting a Grand Champion Overall Showman. A belt buckle will be awarded to the winner.
- Due to Covid19 we will not be hosting the Family Night Dinner on Friday evening.
- Reminder to 2021 graduating seniors to elect on the entry form your desire to receive a scholarship from the TJBEP.
