Ray Community 4-H member awarded Mark of Excellence State Award

Congratulations to Avery Stallmann, a member of Ray Community 4-H club for earning the Mark of Excellence (MOE) State Award. The MOE is the Junior (ages 11 & 12) State award. To apply for the award, 4-H members write a 500 word essay describing their experience in 4-H. The theme is "Because of 4-H I Can..."

When members participate in State awards they:

- Compile and communicate their 4-H experiences in a document that will be adaptable and applicable in their future professional pursuits
- Translate their 4-H experiences in a manner that will make them meaningful and relevant on applications for jobs, scholarships, or school
- Sharpen their interviewing skills with a team of 4-H volunteers or staff

In her essay Avery credits 4-H for building her self-confidence through the many community service opportunities she has had. She writes about the fun she has had performing community

service at Wolcott Farm. She has assisted in the spring for Babies, Babies, Babies in the bunny barn and handing out candy for Boo Barn in the fall.

Avery says better communication is another skill she has developed through 4-H by helping to sell baked goods at Tractor Supply Company. State 4-H Horse Show postponed to 2022

Due to the ongoing complexities of the current COVID-19 public health crisis, Michigan State University Extension has made the decision to postpone the Michigan 4-H State Horse Show until 2022.

MSU Extension remains committed to resuming in-person programming when it is safe to do so. The decision regarding the Michigan 4-H State Horse Show does not indicate that all inperson 4-H summer programming in 2021 will be virtual or postponed. Rather, the decision reflects on the unique nature of the event, which gathers hundreds of participants and thousands of people from across the state together in one central location. The size and scope of this event, combined with a number of uncertainties that remain at this point in the novel coronavirus pandemic, led us to make an early decision about the Michigan 4-H State Horse Show this year.

MSU Extension and 4-H animal science educators will continue to seek out and identify virtual equine learning opportunities that youth can safely take part in throughout the summer months. In addition, when MSU Extension resumes a limited number of face-to-face events, 4-H

educators will identify and share smaller, lower-risk, in-person activities for regional participation.

We appreciate your continued interest in Michigan 4-H programming and for your support and understanding of efforts to protect participant health. We hope to be back together on campus in 2022!

Michigan 4-H Foundation opens 2021-22 grant cycle

Awarded annually, the Michigan 4-H Foundation recently opened their grant and award opportunities for the 2021-2022 season. Open to 4-H volunteer leaders, members and staff, the grants and awards support local 4-H clubs and county programs, as well as recognize members of the 4-H community. All applications are due June 1.

Opportunities include:

- Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants of \$1,000. These grants are awarded to support development of a new program or initiative or to strengthen, enhance or expand a current program that is making a difference.
- **4-H On-Target Grants of \$500**. These grants support 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports.
- The Collins 4-H Youth Horticulture Grant of \$350. This grant is available only to 4-H youth clubs and supports advancement of club work in plant science and horticulture activities.



The 4-H After-School Robotics Club in losco County received a \$1,000 Michigan 4-H Legacy Grant to use VEX Robotics as a tool to help club members develop life skills.

- **4-H Educational Garden Grants of \$1,000**. These grants support the creation of local 4-H educational gardens in Michigan.
- Michigan Farm Bureau 4-H Excellence in Agriculture Award (includes \$1,000 grant). This award recognizes the outstanding achievements of 4-H agricultural volunteers that have exhibited excellence in 4-H youth education and leadership development.
