Michigan 4-H Code of Conduct

Participation in Michigan 4-H programs is subject to the observance of the program rules. Any participant who knowingly violates this Code of Conduct is subject to discipline, up to and including removal from the activity he or she is participating in (at his or her own expense) or the entire county 4-H program. Determination of disciplinary action shall be done with input from the volunteers and staff overseeing the program or activity. Final decisions about discipline will be made by the MSU Extension staff.

Michigan 4-H members will:

- Show respect for, and cooperate with, fellow members, volunteers and staff.
- Follow 4-H policies and procedures when participating in any 4-H sponsored event.
- Under no circumstances, commit or threaten violence toward any individual, group or the program.
- Under no circumstances, possess, sell or consume alcohol or possess, sell or use controlled substances at an MSU Extension 4-H youth activity or event.
- Under no circumstances, attend or participate in an MSU Extension 4-H youth activity or event under the influence of alcohol and/or controlled substances including tobacco, electronic cigarettes, etc.
- Under no circumstances, bring dangerous or unauthorized materials (such as explosives, weapons or similar items) to an MSU Extension 4-H youth activity or event.
- Abstain from harassment or bullying of another participant, volunteer or staff member (either in face to face interactions, through social media or other communication venues), particularly when the behavior is disrespectful as regards a person's gender, race, age, sexual orientation, religion, national origin, disability or appearance.

Not cheat or falsely represent efforts related to 4-H project activities. I have read and I understand the Michigan,4-H Youth Code of Conduct. I agree to abide by the rules stated above.
 I understand I may be removed as a participant from the activity or program, if I fail to follow these rules.

4H Grows Tomorrow's Leaders

Macomb County 4-H Horse & Pony Project Clothing & Footwear

Footwear

Feet should always be covered.

Boots are the required form of footwear when showing horses. The one exception to this rule is costume class where in addition to boots, athletic and other tied shoes are also acceptable forms of footwear. When not in the arena, shoes should cover the feet securely. Bare feet, flip-flops and sandals pose a safety hazard because they don't protect the feet. Loafers and other slip-on shoes are a hazard because they can come off the foot easily.

Clothing

Standard clothing for showing in the ring is English or Western apparel. Mid-drifts, cleavage and buttocks should be covered and undergarments tucked in. T-shirts should not have slogans or advertisements that have sexual connotations or refer to drugs, alcohol or illegal activities. Have spare clothing available in case what you are wearing is not acceptable and you need to change.

In costume classes, the first priority is safety for both the horse and the participant. If riding, participants need to be able to get on and off the horse safely. Costumes should be rated G or PG. Costumes rated PG-13, R and X are unacceptable at 4-H activities.

Fashion changes rapidly and not all fashions are flattering. Youth view fashion differently than adults, and even individuals in the same age group vary in the degree to which they embrace a fashion trend. Moreover, whether fashion is appropriate depends on the situation or setting. What may be acceptable at home may not be acceptable at school or church. What is viewed as okay when hanging out with friends may not be okay when participating in structured programs such as Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts or 4-H.

The bottom line is that not everyone has the same standards and attitudes towards clothing. There are some general standards on which most can agree but there will always be details about which we have to agree to disagree

Jane Sylvester Sportsmanship Award

The Macomb County Hollywood Stars 4-H Club introduced this award in 2002 in memory of Jane Sylvester.

Jane Sylvester spent almost 30 years as a leader in the Macomb County 4-H Horse Project. During that time she touched the lives of many of our members and leaders. She is remembered for the qualities she inspired in all with whom she came in contact. Her generosity, fairness, and modesty were without a doubt one of the truest displays of Sportsmanship. In remembrance and honor, this award is to be presented each year to the 4-H member or Adult Volunteer nominated with those qualities that most display the sense of sportsmanship Jane lived her life with.

A true sportsman is not necessarily the individual that wins or loses the competition. Sportsmanship is the behavior the individual displays while competing. A true sportsman takes defeat without complaining, even if it means they cannot show. They temper the thrill of the victory with modesty and without gloating. Opponents are treated with fairness, courtesy, and generosity. Any member that is involved in the Horse Project to promote a positive experience for themselves and their peers is a candidate for the Jane Sylvester Sportsmanship Award.

It is our hope that those who do remember Jane or never had the opportunity to know her will continue to be touched by her spirit of fairness in the show areas through the introduction of this award.

Each Club registered in the Macomb County Horse & Pony Project may nominate up to 3 individuals for this award. Nominees may be any 4-H member in the Macomb County 4-H Horse Project. Of the 3 individuals, only one may be a member of the club making the nomination. A single page letter of support (form attached) must accompany each nomination.

Who: Knapp Memorial 4-H Horse Leader of the Year

Where: The award will be presented to the Knapp Memorial 4-H Horse Leader of the Year in August at the State 4-H Horse Show, located at the MSU Pavilion for Agriculture and Livestock Education in East Lansing Michigan.



2022 Klusendorf Award Speech

This is the 49th year the Klusendorf award has been presented, to a worthy horse project 4-H member. In 1973 the award was presented the first time. This doesn't seem possible, and I am always very proud to present it. I was a leader in a Macomb County 4-H horse club at that time, and for many years after. I would say that makes the first recipient 56 years of age, many times people ask how the award came into existence, especially new members in the 4-H horse barn. I will tell you Ervin Klusendorf, an Armada resident, served as a recording secretary and manager of this fair, for 14 years. He was at the time of his death the fourth vice president of the Michigan Association of Fairs. Erv passed away suddenly on March 2nd of 1973, at the age of 54 years; he was a much-respected person in the community, and especially those affiliated with this fair. In 1973 a very dedicated 4 -H horse project couple, Red and Floe Conner, who at that time were leaders of the now extinct Bell River 4-H Horse Project Club, decided it would be appropriate to honor Erv's memory. In the meantime, a revolving trophy was purchased. The recipient of this award is determined in the following manner: all of Macomb County 4-H horse project members, English and Western, that received a first placing in their fitting and showing class, are re-judged and the member who then receives the first placing is awarded the trophy. Receiving the award has always been a special honor to any member. I will now announce the past recipients who have received the honor, and if any of these people are in the audience, I again wish to congratulate them.
