# Get ready for the 2020 4-H State Award applications process!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan

4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.. State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards (13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member. Final candidates for the junior, senior and group level awards in each project area will be selected to participate in the State Awards program during 4-H Exploration Days in June where final selection and announcement of winners will take place.

A great introduction to the Michigan 4-H State Awards program, Mark of Excellence contestants write a 500 word essay on the topic of "Because of 4-H, I can..." Winners will receive a certificate of recognition and medal to commemorate their accomplishment.

Essays are due to respective county 4-H offices by February I. County 4-H programs then select up to two youth essays as their representatives and submit those names and essays to the State 4-H Awards Committee. The committee uses the essays to inform the public about what 4-H means to youth and copies are also shared with the Michigan State 4-H Office, Michigan 4-H Foundation, and Kettunen Center.

IV. Reports: A. Secretary - Sadie: the minutes from our last meeting on September 16, 2019 were read. Addie makes a motion to approve the minutes, Taylor seconds. Motion passes that the secretary minutes from last meeting were approved.

B. Treasurer - Cody: \$16,991.80 in our account. \$15,959.39 in our Auction Account. Macey makes a motion to approve the minutes, Ryan seconds. Motion passes that the treasurer reports from last meeting were approved.

C. MSU Extension - Mollie: Mollie would like to thank our leaders and has a little gift for each of them. Mollie would like everyone to know that her expenses for conferences is paid for from scholarships that she has applied for and earned. Also, the part in our pledge where we go "around the world," for my club, my community, my country, and my world" is NOT part of our pledge. Some how this feature got slowly added to our pledge and we would like to encourage leaders to start working on having their youth recite the pledge correctly.

5. Cattle (Jenn): Beef weigh in December 14th 9-11am, \$2 per tag. The show schedule has changed - dairy show will be on Sunday and it will be opened up to out of the county, they can trailer in on Sunday and can show. The participants can be from another county's fair as well!

VI. New Business: A. Fair Checks, Premium Checks: Please get your checks cashed.

B. Community Service Projects Upcoming: We will have monthly community service projects. This Friday at 5 oclock in the MCSB we will be making Thanksgiving Baskets to give out in our community. There will be Christmas Card Making on Sunday, December 15th in this same room at 1 oclock.

C. Beef Weigh In 1. December 14th @ 9am-11am at the Fairgrounds

2. \$2.00 per tag. You can pick those up ahead of time from Mollie at the office, or at the time of weigh-in

3. Animals must have halters and RFID tags.

4. Contact Mollie for the Weigh - In/Registration sheet if you would like to fill it out ahead of time.

5. By Laws read that an animal can be weighed in for each youth and a family alternate for each child. a) For example: a family with 3 kids can weigh-in up to 6 steers.

b) To make it more clear: a 4H member cannot use their brother or sisters (who is also a 4H member) weighed-in steer as an alternate, they would have to have a separately purchased steer.

D. Beef Ultrasound - Possibly cutting it due to Seth Lattimore not being on fairboard and some kids do not understand the true meaning of the ultrasound. Ruthie made a motion to Table until the next meeting to talk to the person who does our ultrasounds, Addie Seconds. Motion passes to table it.

E. Photographer - looking for bids for a photographer. Photographer has to be at the fairgrounds Monday - Thursday, and get the fair pictures organized and in order to Mollie Thursday morning so that she can have them for the auction. Sadie makes a motion to open it to bids, Ruthie seconds. Motion passes.

If anybody knows of a photographer that wold be willing to take the pictures during fair week JLA is willing to take recommendations. They could possibly come in and present some of their work to our 4H members and family.

VII. Committee Reports: A. Trophy - keep the trophies the same as last year or change them. Keeping hoodies for showmanship. Looking at possibly doing personalized items for the winners of classes - examples: personalized halter for horses, and steers, personalized blanket for sheep and goats... etc. Sadie makes a motion to table it until the next meeting, Macey seconds. Motion passes.

B. Budget - a few adjustments were made to the budget based on things that were taken out. Sadie makes a motion to raise the budget for our auction dinner to \$3000 and open it up to accept bids and Kelsei seconds. Sadie amended her motion to raise it to \$4500 and still open it up to bids. Club discussion. Club vote, motion passes. Sadie makes a motion to approve the budget as amended, Nora seconds. Motion passes.

If anybody knows of people who would be willing to help set up the auction dinner please let Mollie know as the Doyle family will be putting together the auction dinner for the last time, and next year it will have to be put together by somebody else. Also if anybody knows of someone who caters or would be willing to maybe smoke a hog and make the side dishes for 500 people+ please let Mollie know and she will get in contact with them!

C. Handbook/By Laws - Some changes were made because of the change in commission. Kelsei brought up a discussion as to why non-Market goat youth participants have to wear black pants and white shirt - Kelsei makes a motion to change the #2 on non-market goats to wear Western Wear while showing goats for non-market, market, and breedstock, Kenzie seconds, motion passes. If you see something that needs to be changed in our JLA Handbook/By Laws please let Mollie know. Ruthie makes a motion to table by-laws to next meeting, Sadie seconds, motion passes.

Sadie makes a motion to extend the meeting due to it being 8:30 and in the By-Laws if a meeting extends passed 90 minutes a motion must be made to extend the meeting, and Macey seconds. Motion passes.

D. Record Books - Jen is presenting for the record book committees. Leaders have a folder with a few more examples of record books as well. Mollie also presented 3 other record books from other counties (Clare County, Newaygo County, and an online record book). Club vote was taken - and Proposal 1 is the new record books.

E. Auction Dinner - not here


