

Menominee County Fair Board reserves to itself authority to make such rules and Regulations governing the control and management of the fair as in its judgment may be necessary and proper to properly carry out the purposes for which said fair is being held. The Fair Board also reserves to itself the authority to establish what admission shall be charged.

The Menominee County Fair will use diligence to ensure the safety of livestock and articles entered for exhibition or display after their arrival on the fair grounds. However, exhibitors of these articles or livestock will assume all risk other than that which may fall under the public liability and property damage coverage.

The Menominee County Fair reserves to itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, and to cancel any entries and awards of prizes without claim for damages.

EXHIBITORS' PROCEDURES

The Menominee County Fair Manager reserves the right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the operation of the Menominee County Fair. Fair reserves the right to hold premiums for excessive mess left.

By disregarding or violating any rules or regulations any exhibitor or contestant forfeits all premiums, rights and privileges without recourse and will be subject to such penalty as the Menominee County Fair Board may order. If doubt arises as to the meaning or application of a rule, the Manager shall interpret the same. Pre-entry is required on exhibits of dairy and beef cattle, goats, sheep, rabbits, poultry, riding horses, draft

horses, youth department, home economics, and fair queen/princess entries

Closing date for pre-entry is July 5, 2021. Applications for pre-entry should be made on the printed form provided in the premium book for that purpose. Additional application forms may be obtained from the Fair Office or menomineecounty.com website. A separate entry blank MUST be used for each department. No additional entries accepted after pre-entry closing date. All pre-entries should be addressed to Menominee County Fair, S904 U.S. Highway 41, Stephenson, MI 49887.

All exhibits MUST be the work of the individual in whose name the exhibit is entered. Pre-entry is required, for all events except Tractor and Truck Pull, Garden Tractor Pull, Horse and Pony Pull. Absolutely no registrations will be accepted after the deadline date of July 5, 2021.

JUNIOR SHOW RULES

- 1. Competition is open to anyone who has not reached his or her 20th birthday before January 1st, 2021. Age of all members will be determined as of January 1st, 2021. Birth Certificate may be required for proof of age if there is a question or protest. **Birth Certificate is required for first time exhibitors (CLOVERBUDS).**
- 2. Rules: The junior exhibitor will abide by the general exhibitors' rules of the Menominee County Fair and any special rules set up in this Premium Book.
- 3. Requirements: Animals may be either grade or purebred unless otherwise designated. All animals must be owned for 30 days prior to entry and the exhibitor must feed, fit, groom, train and show the animal himself/herself. All animals must be trained to lead. Rope or leather halters may be used.
- 4. Identification: Animals must be identified by diagram, picture, or ear tag number; and it is the sole responsibility of the junior exhibitor to have the animal so identified and recorded on the Pre-entry blank.

Entry fees for all livestock, small animals, queen/princess contest, and horse shows MUST be sent with the pre-entry blanks. Entry fees for tractor pull, horse and pony pull, and 4×4 pull will be collected at time of weigh-in.

The department Superintendent will be responsible for stall and pen assignments for animals. All stalls and pens should be kept clean and well bedded. No grooming inside barn. Stalls and aisles will be cleaned in a timely fashion.

No livestock will be housed on the fairground property prior to Thursday morning, without a special permit from the Fair Manager. Each exhibitor will provide all feed and bedding for their animals, unless otherwise stipulated by the Superintendent of each department.

Health requirements: The state veterinarian or his/her representative may inspect animals as they arrive on the grounds or at any time during the fair.

Substitutions of animals within the same class, entered for reasons satisfactory to the superintendent and with the approval of the Manager, will be permitted

The Superintendent will direct the calling of classes for judging in accordance with the printed program as far as practicable and will see the judge's report fully upon each animal or article exhibited in each class

If there is any question as to the regularity of an entry or the right of any animal or article to compete in any class, the matter shall be submitted to the Superintendent in charge of that department for adjustment.

The decision of the judges shall be final, and no appeal will be considered except in the cases of protests to the Fair Manager. Objections to any person serving as a judge must be submitted to the superintendent in writing, *prior to making any award*, giving good and sufficient reasons therefore. The Superintendent shall refer this to the Manager who shall have full power to act.

Formal Protests: A formal protest by an agricultural exhibitor shall be made in writing to the Manager, accompanied by an affidavit setting forth the grounds for the protest. A formal protest against an agricultural exhibition of animals or articles shall be filed not less than 24 hours before judging. A formal protest against a placing shall be filed no more than six hours after the placing has been made, and shall be considered by the Manager. Interested parties shall be duly notified and given an opportunity to submit evidence pursuant to a procedure established by the Manager, before a final decision is made. In addition to the rights of protest herein guaranteed to interested parties, the Fair Board expressly reserves the right, within the scope or power of its authority, to take cognizance of any attempt at fraud, as may be found from the evidence relating hereto, and to act as may be deemed just and proper.

Awards: Judges' sheets will be used as sole evidence for payment of premiums. Ribbons and tags are not accepted.

An entry in any department, including an entry made under the Danish System of judging, does not guarantee a premium award.

THE MENOMINEE COUNTY FAIR BOARD RESERVES THE RIGHT TO PRO-RATE ALL PREMIUMS.

Fire regulations: Smoking will not be permitted in any exhibition buildings.

Animal rights activists may hand out literature **only** in designated area. Failure to comply will result in immediate removal from the premises.

Procedure for Filing A Complaint or Appeal with the Fair

Exhibitors have 10 days from the close of the fair to file a complaint or appeal with the fair. The fair must define the steps for the board review, investigation and issuing a notice of finding and recommended actions. The exhibitor has 45 days from the date that the complaint was filed with the fair to file an appeal with the Department of Agriculture. The department has 60 days to investigate the appeal and issue a report on the findings.

Person wishing to file a complaint can pick up a form at the Fair Office at S904 US 41, Stephenson, MI 49887 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. – 1 p.m. Monday thru Thursday. Return completed form to the Fair Office. A Fair Board of reviews meeting will be called to investigate the complaint and return recommended actions. If said person is not happy with the recommended actions, they can then file an appeal with the Department of Agriculture.

**All sheep and goats must have official USDA tag showing they have undergone testing for scrappies. All cattle must provide evidence of negative testing for BVD PI and have RFID ear tags. RULES FOR THE DAIRY AND BEEF SHOW

- 1. BE SURE YOU ENTER YOUR ANIMALS IN THE RIGHT CLASS, ACCORDING TO THE AGE OF THE ANIMAL.
- 2. A \$10 entry fee will be charged for each entry.
- 3. All animals must be pre-registered. The entry fee must be paid at the time of pre-registration. No animal may be shown unless

- animal is pre-registered by July 5, 2021. No money will be accepted at the fairgrounds.
- Cattle will be shown according to their age, as determined by registration papers. Grades may use DHIA records to prove age of animals.
- 5. Each farm is limited to 10 entries, in addition to the Youth Department entries from the farm for dairy and beef.
- 6. Youth Department entrants may exhibit one animal per class in Open Class in addition to the other animals from that farm.
- 7. Dairy Herd Classes 20 & 21 must be made up from the animals from one farm, including Youth Department entries from the farm.
- 8. All animals must be identified by ear tag or tattoo.
- 9. Production premiums will be paid on the high DHIA or Owner-Sampler actual record certified by the DHIA supervisor. There will be a \$3 per cow entry fee, paid when the records are submitted.
- 10. Feed, water and bedding must be supplied by the exhibitor.
- 11. Only first place animals are eligible for Grand Champion.
- 12. First place animals are also eligible for Reserve Champion. The second-place winner in the class from which the champion was selected should be brought into the ring for judging.
- 13. All decisions of the judge will be final. Premiums will be paid on the judge's placing of the animals.
- 14. Dairy Cattle should be brought to the fairgrounds between 9 and 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, July 17th. They must remain on the grounds for viewing until 4 p.m. on Saturday afternoon.
- 15. Beef Cattle should be brought to the fairgrounds for registration on Friday, July 16th, from 8-4:00 p.m. Junior show members will exhibit according to their age as of January 1, 2021. Junior showmen may enter one animal per class.
- 16. Youth between the ages of 8 and 19 may enter the Youth Departments. Ages 5-7 are eligible for Cloverbud Classes ONLY. Parents must accompany Cloverbud exhibitors.
- 17. All 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters, and any other youth groups may enter the group contests.

RULES THAT APPLY TO SHEEP & GOAT SHOW

- 1. Sheep exhibits in the Youth Department are open to any youth who has reached age 8 by January 1st, 2021 or has not reached his/her 20th birthday by January 1st, 2021 with the exception of any Cloverbud Youth Classes for ages 5 - 7.
- 2. Exhibitor must furnish food and water.
- 3. Animals must be properly cared for by exhibitor.
- 4. Exhibitors are limited to two (2) entries in each youth class and open class (only 1 market lamb may be exhibited).

- 1. Judging for poultry will follow the current American Poultry Association (A.P.A.) Standard of Perfection text.
- **2.** The Poultry Youth department is open to any youth who has reached his/her 8th birthday by January1,2021, or has not reached their 20th birthday by January 1, 2021.
- 3. Adults may only exhibit in the Poultry Adult department. Youth exhibitors may show in both the Adult & Youth Depts. but with separate animals in both departments.
- 4. Adult & Youth exhibitors will be allowed to enter up to 2 entries per breed class, not to exceed 10 total birds in breed classes.
- 5. Exhibitors in Junior Poultry Market classes are limited to one entry per class.
- **6.** Birds shown as individual exhibits will not be able to be shown as part of a trio. All birds shall be of a recognized breed.
- **6.** Poultry must remain on the fairgrounds for public viewing from time of placement until 4:00P.M. on Sunday. At 4:00 P.M. the superintendent will release the classes. If inclement weather should befall the fair, it will be the superintendent's discretion to allow for an early release of birds before 4:00 P.M. on Sunday.
- 7. Infectious Laryngotrachitis (ILT) vaccinated birds will not be allowed on the fairgrounds
- 8. All poultry (with the exception of pigeons and waterfowl) exhibited are required to be tested for Pollorum-typhoid before they can be exhibited. This testing will be free of charge to the exhibiter when the bird is brought on Thursday for placement.
- 8. All birds must be dusted for external parasites (lice and mites) prior to entry. Any living lice or mites or their egg masses remaining in the feathers, will make the bird ineligible for entry into the poultry department. All birds will be examined on Thursday during registration.
- **9.** Exhibitors desiring to dispose of their breeding stock may post a sign on their cages after judging. The sign shall include the name and phone number of seller and asking price and attached to the cage securely. The sale is between the seller and buyer. The M.C. Fair Board is not responsible for any sales.
- **10.** All eggs laid in pens during the Fair will become the property of M.C. Fair.
- 11. All Exhibitors are responsible for the feeding and watering of their own birds. Exhibitors are encouraged to provide their own water and feed cups.
- 12. Exhibitors will be allowed to bring their own feed but may choose to use the feed donated to the fair.
- 13. All Exhibitors are responsible for the feeding, watering and cleaning of pens of their own animals. Morning chores are to be completed by 10:00 A.M. Afternoon chores are to be completed between 4 and 6 P.M.
- 14. All dove exhibitors will be required to bring their own dove size cages as the fair does not have dove cages on hand.

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RULES FOR HORSE AND PONY PULLING

- 1. Horse and Pony pulling contest will be held on Friday, July 16th at approximately 4 p.m. with weigh-in to begin at 3 p.m.
- 2. No mileage will be paid. Stone boat rules will govern contest for horse pull
- 3. No stimulated or drugged horses or ponies will be allowed to pull.
- 4. Each driver must take first pull after weight change, except on warm-up loads.
- 5. Each team will be driven by one driver throughout the entire contest, except in
- 6. Any forward movement of load after driver gives command to go will be counted as a pull.
- 7. The weight of the load will be determined by the judges.
- 8. Three trials to each load. The driver must stay hooked for his second trial and return for the third trial. Third trial can be pulled either way.
- 9. There will not be over three tries to hitch or it will be counted as a pull.
- 10. If any horse steps on or over the ropes while pulling, the team will be disqualified for that given pull. This must be called by the judges.
- 11. No one horse will be allowed to pull in two classes.
- 12. Driver must be ready when his turn comes to pull.
- 13. If any team takes too long to get ready to pull, his pull can be taken away.
- 14. Any team declared unmanageable will be sent to the truck by the judges.
- 15. All pulling horses may be subject to a saliva and urine test by a state-licensed veterinarian.
- 16. Regulation No. 813: R235, 813.2 Drugs illegal to use. Rule 2 It is illegal to administer, internally or externally, a drug of a nature that could affect or alter the normal performance of a horse in a harness race or an animal entered in a pulling contest where state funds are used for any portion of the premiums offered.

- D. Ponies will be measured at the third vertebrae of the withers standing in a natural position; shoes will be deducted from the height of the pony.
- E. Ponies will be measured by appointed committee of the fair at the fairgrounds.
- F. Each driver will be allowed two helpers; one to be at the head, if desired; all other helpers and judges to stay behind eveners.
- G. All ponies must pull in their own class.

Rules that apply to Horse Pulling only:

A. An entry fee of \$10 for each class is to be paid at the time of entry. B. Split Overweight teams must be weighed between 3 p.m. - 4 p.m. CST at the

fairgrounds.



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- C. The distance for each pull shall be 27-1/2 feet, but distance of less than 27-1/2 feet will be used to determine the winner of placement at the end of contest.
- D. Each driver will be allowed two helpers in hitching.
- E. Drivers shall not prod, whip or touch horses while pulling and shall drive with reasonably tight lines and in no case will a driver be allowed to whirl or shake lines over horses or above his own head while pulling. No driver will be allowed to jump doubletrees.

- 1. Contest is open to anyone 18 years of age or older at the time of the contest.
- 2. All tractors will be weighed in between 9 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. CST Saturday July 17, 2021 at the Fairgrounds at Shakey Lakes Park.
- 3. An entry fee of \$20 per class plus \$5 per person fair admission at gate.
 4. Tractors shall not operate more than 15% over factory rated RPM's. Maximum and minimum speeds are to be determined by judges.
- 5. Judges have the right to stop and/or disqualify any contestant if tractor is being operated in an unsafe manner and if any modifications are detected.
- 6. Contestant must furnish own clevis.
- 7. Only one pull allowed unless a tie is declared. Pull is ended when engine stalls or forward motion stops. No jerking or hole digging allowed.
- 8. No one allowed on track except for officials and contestants; no helpers. Track is the area 24 feet in any direction of contest area boundaries.
- 9. Contest open only for tractors rubber-tired with 2-wheel drive. No dual wheels or tire chains allowed. 4-wheel drive tractors can pull with 2 wheels engaged.
- 10. Only one person allowed on tractor when pulling and that driver must remain seated while pulling. Weight includes driver; no changes allowed after weigh-in. All weights must be bolted to tractor either on the wheels, front-end or frame.
- 11. Drawbars shall be standard factory equipment with a maximum height of 20 inches; must be stationary and extend beyond rear wheels. Drawbars will be checked and measured before tractor is allowed to pull.
- 12. Tractors must be equipped with a hood and grill.
- 13. No slipping of clutch permitted, downshifting permissible providing forward motion doesn't stop.
- 14. If the superintendent believes any contestant to be a safety hazard because of the consumption of alcoholic beverages or drugs, the contestant shall be barred from the contest
- 15. All entries subject to above rules. If any question arises regarding rules or any other part of the contest, the decision of the superintendent shall be final.

16. A tractor can only pull in two (2) classes.

Antique tractors must be 1938 to 1957or older. Any tractor in question as to being 1938 or older must have the serial number in the proper place and must be read easily. Tractors must have stock blocks and no external parts manufactured for tractors built later than 1938. Any tractor that has a serial number or parts to make a newer tractor appear legal will be disqualified. Any tractor that has a serial number or parts to make a newer tractor appear legal will be disqualified. Engine speed must be controlled by throttle lever only. No strings, wires or foot feeds allowed. Any gas-operated tractor must use gasoline only. The decision of the track judges will be final on areas of dispute not covered in these rules. No tractors equipped with torque amplifier or converter or any "shift on the go" device will not be allowed to shift on the go. Tractor weights must not extend ahead of front wheels.

Rear weights must not extend more than 24 inches behind the center of the rear axle. Weights must be securely fastened to the tractor. Weights must not interfere with the hook-up. If anything falls off tractor it will be disqualified. Judge's decision will be final regarding pull and/or equipment.

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
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

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

Meat Rabbit/All-Breed Rabbit/Cavy Show Rules 2021

- 1) All exhibitors are required to feed, water, and clean their rabbit cage pans daily. Sweep around cage and isle. Complete all chores by 10 am. Afternoon chores are done between 4pm to 6pm.
- Exhibitors provide their own tack: water bottles, crocks, feed, etc. M.C.F. will not provide feed. It is the
 responsibility of the exhibitors to feed and water their own animals. Cavies require exhibitor furnished
 cage.
- 3) Recommended Meat Class Rabbit Breeds: Californian, American, Cinnamon, Champagne D'Argents, Crème D'Argents, New Zealand, Silver Fox, Rex, Flemish Giant, American, American Chinchilla, Standard Chinchilla, Satin, Palomino, Blanc De Hotot, or any Crossbred of the above listed.
- 4) Department 13 and 14 Shows will be on Friday, at 9 AM. Judging as follows: Jr. Rabbit Showmanship, Jr. Rabbit Meat Classes, and then the Jr. All-Breed Rabbit/Cavy Show. Open All-Breed Show is last.
- 5) Exhibitors between the ages of 8-19 as of Jan. 1st of the current fair year can participate in youth show & sale.
- 6) <u>Tattoo</u> meat rabbits in the <u>left ear</u> prior to entry. Tattoo must match the registration/entry form. Tattoo can either be pen or clamp style. All-Breed Rabbits/Cavies <u>don't</u> require a tattoo/tag, but it is <u>highly recommended</u>.
- 7) Inspection of rabbits will happen upon arrival. If found with parasites/diseases/open cuts or sores/nasal discharge, the rabbit(s) will be sent home immediately.
- 8) Check/weigh-in is Thursday, between 10 AM to 6 PM. If market rabbit does not make weight, the market rabbit will be removed from the scale, the scale will be calibrated again, and the market rabbit will be re-weighed. Entries must be completely dry at weigh-in. If Meat Pen/Fryer does not make min. weight, the exhibit will have to go home. If any of the rabbits go over the max. weight limit for their class, then the exhibit may move up to the next weight class referenced in item 9. If the exhibit is a meat pen, then the largest rabbit may move to the single Roaster Class and the other two animals must go home unless the meat the single fryer guidelines. Roasters may move up to Stewers if necessary.
- 9) Exhibitors are allowed to enter and sell one exhibit in each of the following classes (4 Total entries):
 - a. **Meat Pen:** Three individual rabbits weighing between 3 1/2 to 5 1/2 pounds each, not over 70 days old. (Ideally, exhibitor will own the breeding stock to produce entry).
 - b. **Fryer:** One individual rabbit weighing between 3 1/2 to 5 1/2 pounds, not over 70 days old. (Ideally, exhibitor will own the breeding stock to produce entry).
 - c. Roaster: One individual rabbit weighing between 5 1/2 and 9 pounds, not over 6 months old.
 - d. **Stewers:** One individual rabbit weighing over 8 pounds, over 6 months, but less than 1 year old.
- 10) There will be a Grand and Reserve Champion selected from all of the listed meat classes above. Exhibitors that do not receive Grand or Reserve may pull their entries from the sale after the show is completed. Exhibitor must notify the Superintendent ASAP if not selling.
- 11) There will be a Best-In-Show and a Reserve-In-Show selected from all entries in the All-Breed Rabbit/Cavy Show for both youth and open.
- 12) All-Breed Rabbit/Cavy entries are limited to two per class for both Youth and Open. Youth can enter in Youth classes as well as Open classes. The entry however, cannot be the same rabbit/cavy. Adults can only enter in the Open Classes. Limit of 10 entries per department.
- 13) The exhibitor must raise or purchase Meat Pens/Fryers/Roasters/Stewers. If purchased, animals should be in the exhibitor's possession by the following dates: **Meat Pens/Fryers: Fair Entry Deadline, Roasters: Fair Entry Deadline. Dates will change next year.**

- 14) All Exhibitors will be required to bring their rabbit/cavy to the judging table. Exhibitors that are absent will be considered a "No Show" and their entry will not be judged or sell at auction. An exception to this rule is a physical issue prohibiting the exhibitor from presenting their animal. (Broken Arm, etc.) If approved by the Superintendent prior to show, the exhibitor may choose another youth exhibitor to present the animal for them.
- 15) Each Meat Entry will require a \$3.00 Entry Fee and a \$2.00 Stall Fee. All-Breed rabbits are a \$2.00 Stall fee only. New Cage priority goes to the meat rabbits.
- 16) Sale will be Sunday at noon. Location determined by weather. Exhibitors are to meet in the Barn by 11:30 am.
- 17) Sale order will be as follows for each market class: Grand, Reserve, blue, red, and then white ribbon winners from lightest to heaviest. Sale order will be posted Friday night or Saturday Morning in the barn.
- 18) Checkout is required for all exhibitors/self-haul buyers on <u>Sunday between 4pm & 5pm</u>. All exhibitors must remove rabbits from cages and clean/disinfect pans prior to leaving on Sunday. If pans/cages are not found cleaned, the exhibitor will forfeit all their premium money earned. Confirm with Superintendent before leaving.
- 19) If found cheating or abusing the rules at any time by the Fair Board and/or Superintendent(s), the exhibitor will not be permitted to sell at auction. The Fair Board/Superintendent(s) will determine if the infraction warrants the exhibitor's removal from any future participation at the fair. All exhibitors must sign this compliance sheet saying that they will abide by all the stated rules.
- 20) All exhibitors wanting to sell must also participate in Rabbit Showmanship. Age categories are as follows: Junior (8-11 years), Intermediate (12-15 years), and Senior (16-19 years).
- 21) All exhibitors wanting to sell must also participate in Record Keeping. Turn Record Sheets into the Superintendent by Friday at 6:00 pm in order to be eligible for the Sunday Sale. One set of record sheets per meat class entry is required. You can request a copy of the record sheets from the Menominee County Extension Office or your local Menominee County 4H Club Leader.
- 22) Scoring of Record Books will be completed by Sunday at 3 pm. Danish system ribbons will be awarded for each age group as follows: Junior (8-11 years), Intermediate (12-15 years), and Senior (16-19 years). Ribbons are distributed at 3:30 pm on Sunday of the fair in the barn.
- 23) A Stable Management Award is given to an exhibitor that provides exceptional participation in daily chores and tasks. Award is presented at 3:30 pm on Sunday of the fair in the barn.
