Market Class rabbits must be kindled and raised by member. Brood Doe must be in possession by May 1st.

Turkeys	In possession by March 15th, 20-25 weeks, 15-40 pounds
Ducks	In possession by May 13th, 80-100 days, minimum 4 pounds

Roasters	In possession by May 25th, 9-12 weeks, minimum 8 pounds
Broilers	MUST be purchased through SAA by May 5th, minimum 3 pounds
