^{*:} Classes in this section are required to submit 4 to 6 photos of your animal. Additionally, exhibitors must include a video no longer than 90 seconds of the animal walking and being set up.

^{#:} Classes in this section will require a video no longer than 90 seconds and should be continuous in nature with no narrative. The exhibitor should utilize the camera person as the judge, moving their animal away and around the camera person as they would be showing their animal in the showring. The video should include all angles of the animal in order for a judge to make an evaluation. Video must contain footage of the animal walking and being set up and changing sides. The exhibitor is required to be in the video at all times. Up to 4 still photos are also required, one showing their goat set up, fully shaved, and in whites. Other photos may include trimmed feet and shaving. Additionally, youth will be prompted to write a 200-250 word essay on showing and preparing a goat. More information on how to take a good photo and video can be found at the MSU Extension Virtual Learning Showcase and Auction website. Additional information will be sent on how to upload your video and photos.

^{^:} Classes in this section will require a video no longer than 4 minutes and should be continuous in nature with no narrative. The exhibitor is required to be in the video at all times. The video must contain footage of the member walking their goat over at least 4 different obstacles they 6/25/2020

have created. Evaluation and Awards: All classes will be evaluated using the Danish method (i.e. A, B, C). Champion and Reserve Champion designations will be awarded per breed and for pack; Grand and Reserve Grand Champion designations will be awarded for dairy and non-dairy breeds; for showmanship, there will be Champion designations per age division with an overall Champion. Cloverbuds will receive participation ribbons. Premiums will be awarded where applicable.
