ATTENTION: ALL BEEF EXHIBITORS

RE: Mandatory YQCA Certification

Following a recommendation made by the State of Michigan and Napoleon Livestock, the Monroe County 4-H Junior Livestock Association discussed and voted in favor requiring ALL beef exhibitors to complete an online YQCA certification in order to exhibit at the Monroe County Fair.

This ANNUAL age-specific training will cost \$12.00 per exhibitor (payable via credit card on website), and will take approximately 1 hour to complete. Upon completion, you must send a copy of your certificate to Sara Lewis at the 4-H Extension Office via email <u>seitzsa1@msu.edu</u>, or mail 963 South Raisinville Road, Monroe, MI 48161 no later than Thursday, May 2, 2019!! If this is not completed by the deadline, <u>you will NOT be able to exhibit your steer at the fair.</u>

This is our new Beef Quality Assurance program. If we do not participate in a beef quality program, the large packers will not buy our animals, resulting in a major price loss when sold at places like Napoleon Livestock or United Producers. This would be very unfair to our buyers. Since we don't know who is buying your steer, every exhibitor will participate. We are the first large animal barn to participate in YQCA, but I assure you all other barns will follow in the future. This is what the consumer wants from the producer. Please be understanding and supportive of this program. We will help you in every way we can.

Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience March 17-20, 2019

4-H Capitol Experience is a four-day conference held in Lansing that focuses on civic engagement and public policy. The program is open to ALL high school students in Michigan. Each year, 75 to 100 students take action on issues that matter to them and learn how they can have an influence on state government and laws.

After choosing current issue areas (options below), participants interact with legislators, tour Michigan's Capitol, meet with state agency staff, lobbyists and other state-level experts, discover how policy is made, and explore various careers in public policy. Recreation is included in the schedule. At the end of the conference, the teens leave with an understanding of the impact that their voice can have on policy and their communities - now and in the future.

Choose Your Issue Area

Participants will choose their top three issue areas and will learn about one. They will work with other teens to draft a bill related to their issue and will go through a legislative simulation. Issue group choices include:

4-H Youth develop entrepreneurial skills and earn cash prize though 4-H beekeeping essay contest!



Michigan 4-H youth can improve their science, knowledge, writing and research skills and win a cash prize by entering the <u>2019 4-H Beekeeping Essay Competition</u> (http://preservationofhoneybees.org/essays)

"This year's essay topic is Honey Varietals, State to State. Each jar of honey reflects an unrepeatable combination of climate, soil, weather and flowers. Each state has unique honey varietals that beekeepers can market to their customers. Please identify one unique varietal to your state and discuss the flower's uniqueness and how beekeepers can effectively market that varietal. Please include a photo of the varietal's flower, an interview with a local beekeeper who collects this varietal and a recipe that highlights the varietal."

The top three winners nationally will receive cash prizes of \$750, \$500 and \$250, and winning essays will be published in ABF Quarterly, the magazine of the American Beekeeping Federation. The three national winners and the top winner of each state will receive a book about honey bees, beekeeping or honey.

Essay length should be 750 to 1000 words and will be judged on the scope of research, accuracy, creativity, conciseness and logic development of the topic. Youth are encouraged to research the topic using a number of sources. <u>Download the</u> <u>complete rules</u> (http://preservationofhoneybees.org/images/2019_4-H_Beekeeping_Essay_Competition_Call_for_Entries.pdf)before beginning the contest. This contest is sponsored by the Foundation for the Preservation of Honey Bees, Inc., a non-profit corporation, to preserve the practice and the profession of beekeeping through education and research, established by the American Beekeeping Federation.

All Michigan 4-H entries must be submitted electronically to Laura Quist at <u>quistla1@msu.edu</u> by February 15, 2019. A state winner will be selected and must be submitted to the Foundation for the Preservation of Honey Bees, Inc. by February 28, 2019 as Michigan's entry in the National 4-H Beekeeping Essay Competition.

Youth Safe Tractor and Machinery Operation Program

The U.S. Department of Labor's Fair Standard Act restricts what children under the age of 16 can legally do as employees in and around agricultural equipment and tractors that are more than 20 PTO HP, whether working in landscape or production agriculture industry.

Program Participants will:

- \Rightarrow Receive 25 Hours of Instruction Covering 48 Core Tasks
- \Rightarrow Gain First-Hand Tractor Operation Experience
- \Rightarrow Receive a Certificate of Completion (upon successful completion of the course)



The Monroe County 4-H Youth Development Program is offering this 10 week program to youth 13-19 years old in Monroe and surrounding counties. Participants will receive a certificate upon completion of the program pending passing score on written exam, successful pre-driving skills test and a driving test. Youth 14-15 years old are also eligible to receive an official certificate of training from the U.S. Department of Labor (required for operations of 20HP or greater, garden or agricultural tractor by 14 and 15 year old youth employed on property not owned, leased or operated by a parent or legal guardian).

- Farm & Workplace Hazards & Safety
- Tractor Component Basics
- Pre-Operation Procedures

- Operation Basics
- Tractor-Powered Implements
- Self Propelled Agricultural Equipment
- Operation on Public Road ways

<u>WHO:</u> Open to all 13-19 year old youth interested in training and certification. Youth must be 14 by the day of the driving test (May 11) to receive the U.S. Dept. of Labor Certificate. Youth 16 to 19 do not need a certification for employment but are welcome to participate in the program. Interested parents are welcome to attend any sessions with their children

<u>COST</u>: \$25 per participant for current 4-H Members/ \$45 for non-4-H members. Cash or check made payable to <u>Michigan State</u> <u>University</u> (credit cards also accepted at the MSU Extension Office only). Fee includes comprehensive student manual.

World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute registrations due April 1

As millions across the globe deal with food insecurity, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute (WFP MIYI) offers young people an opportunity to be part of the solution. Held May 9, the event seeks to inspire and propage the part generation of global leaders to and war

prepare the next generation of global leaders to end world hunger.

Occurring in two locations, East Lansing and Marquette/Chatham, attendees have the opportunity to share their ideas related to global food security with experts and other Michigan youth while learning how university faculty and staff members, researchers and students are working to address world hunger.

To participate, youth should be in grades 8-12 and register by the April I deadline. As part of the registration process, youth are required to prepare a two- to five-page research paper about one of twenty grand global challenges which are related to food, hunger and poverty. At the event, youth present and discuss their papers with other attendees and research and industry experts. They also participate in interactive activities related to global food challenges and engage with area experts to discuss solutions to global hunger and poverty.
