

# Volunteers

- 2. Go to our Volunteer Central <a href="https://msu.samaritan.com/">https://msu.samaritan.com/</a> to complete your annual Code of Conduct and Background Check authorizations.

# Frequently Asked Questions

We've had many questions regarding volunteer status leading up to this fair season, so here are some details to help out.

• How do I become an approved volunteer with 4-H? We're so glad you asked! The first step is to apply at the Volunteer Central Website

## https://msu.samaritan.com/

- What is the MSU Volunteer Selection Process (VSP)? This is our screening process for accepting adult volunteers who wish to interact on behalf of 4-H programs and activities.
   Once approved, you'll just need to renew annually to remain active.
- What does it mean to be a GOLD vs. Silver Volunteer? All Club leaders, Superintendents, and other individuals who will be interacting with youth should be GOLD status. Gold volunteers should also be enrolled in 4honline and are eligible for wristbands during fair week. Silver Volunteer Status should only be used for those individuals who have no direct interaction with youth or vulnerable populations on behalf of MSU Extension. This could be someone working at a registration table, at our 4-H Activity Center during fair week, as a building guard, or at a youth or adult event with at least one Gold Status volunteer or MSU Extension employee present, etc. Silver Volunteers can only receive one day passes for kitchen or guard duty that they may be working. These individuals do not register in 4honline.



As we start to think ahead to the New Year, how can 4-H clubs resolve to improve in the year ahead? Here are ten suggestions to make the upcoming year a successful one.

#### Resolve that:

- 1. Club meetings will start and end on time.
- 2. Business meetings will follow Robert's Rules of Order and that all club paperwork, such as minutes, club inventory and financial statements, will be completed in a timely manner.
- 3. All members will take part in discussions and have a say in decisions that are made. Keep a chart with each members' name and when they speak at business meetings.
- 4. The club meeting place will be a safe, comfortable and welcoming environment for all club members.
- 5. Fun will be included in each meeting.
- 6. A learning activity will be included in each club meeting. Ideas include exploring a new 4-H curriculum, having members volunteer to do a demonstration, doing a show and tell about each members' favorite project, or bringing in a guest speaker.
- 7. The club will pursue at least one community service project chosen, planned and celebrated by the club.
- 8. New members will have a buddy they may talk with about any 4-H questions.
- 9. The 4-H pledge will be said at every meeting.
- 10. Every club member will be recognized in some way to let them know they are cared about.
