- ☺ Safety of the child should be the primary concern of the Cloverbud project.



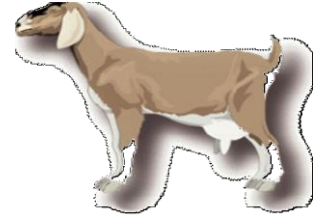

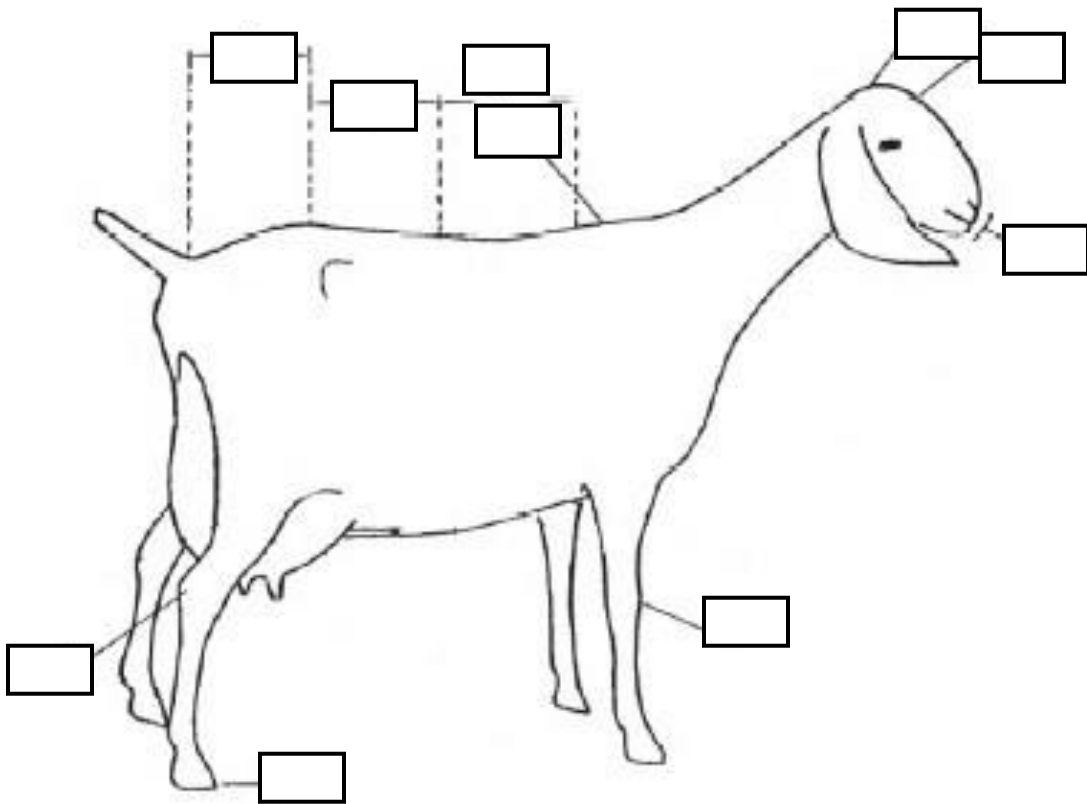

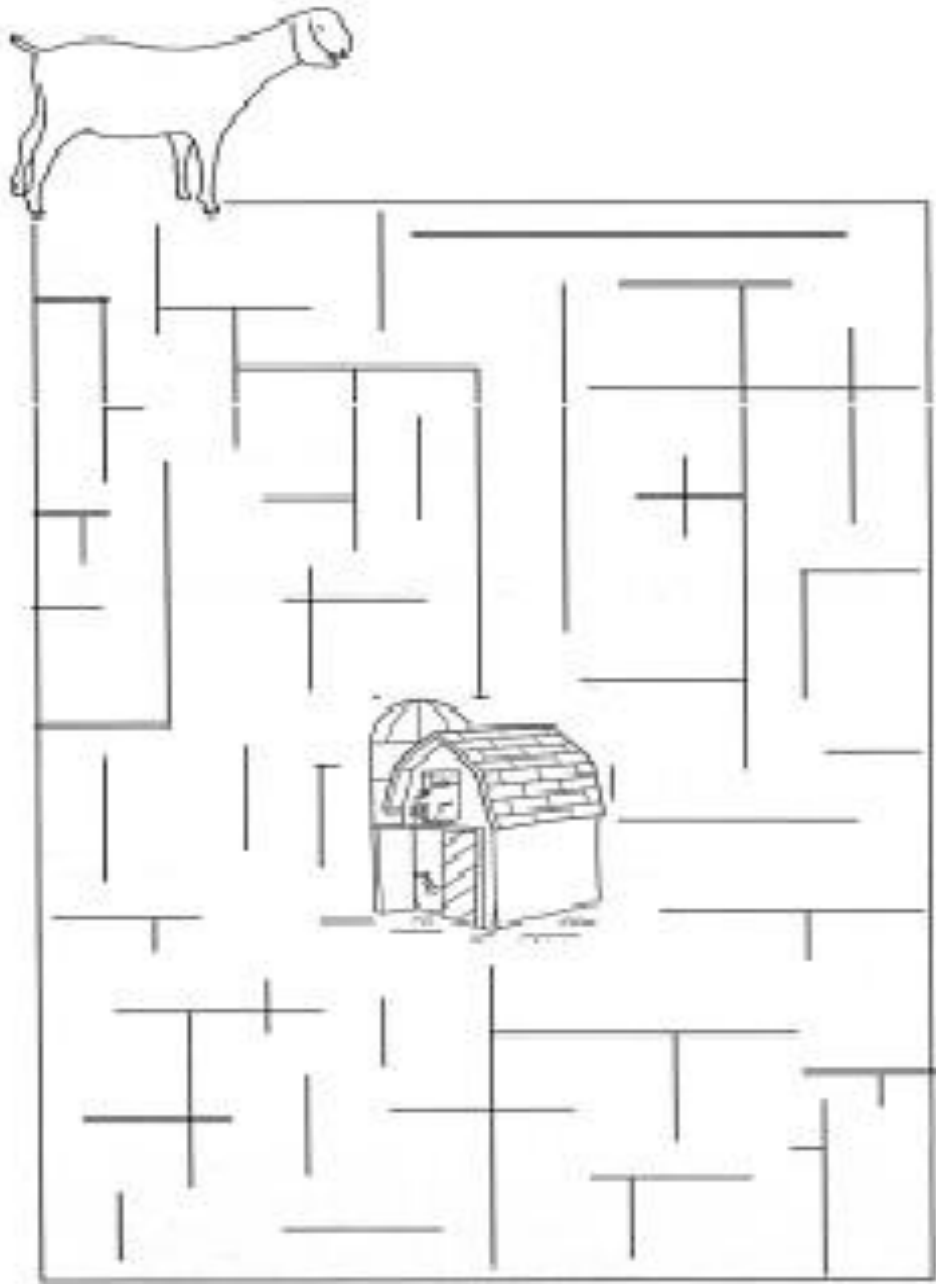
