After meeting these requirements youth ages 5-7 may sell goats, rabbits, or poultry. To show a feeder calf a youth must meet the minimum age requirement of 7 to have their own animal at the Fair. Young beef is not an option for Junior Market as a youth must be at least 9 for this project. All youth ages 5 -7 years old with animals on leads, are required to have an adult or teen in close proximity of the arena for safety reasons. We have volunteered to assist the fair Board with this project since it will occur the same time as our 4-H SMAA auction.
