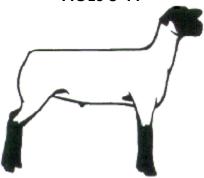

I also understand that integrity and responsibility are important to this 4-H experience.

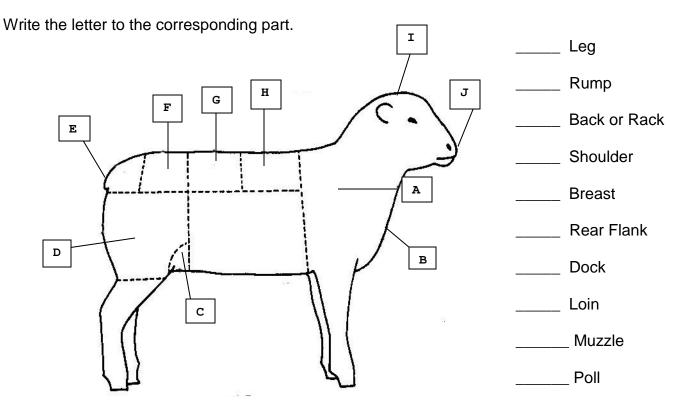
