

MSU Extension Youth Demographic Data Collection 4-H Online Crosswalk

It is important to us to provide ways for all participants to identify themselves. We are also obligated to report these data to USDA NIFA through 4-H Online who requires data to be presented in specific fields. This document explains how to take the data collected from the youth demographics form and enter it into **4-H Online Group Enrollments**.

Group Enrollments are used to enter participant data into 4-H Online to account for educational programming with groups that may or may not include 4-H members.

If a participant **chose not to respond** or has a non-binary gender, they will not be reported in 4-H Online. Instead, only include those participants on the demographics page in PEARS.

<u>Duplicates will need to be subtracted for youth that indicate they are Michigan 4-H members.</u> The only time you will enter ALL participants will be in the Gender Distribution section.
