The GLLA's Emerging Leader Program focuses on the context of current issues and brings together current leaders in government, non-profits, and industry to broaden their perspectives about key sustainability issues and consider how leadership for the common good can influence Michigan's future. Three, four-day sessions over a seven-month period (April, August, October).

Internal MSUE nomination deadline: September 1, 2019. Submit nomination.

Great Lakes Leadership Academy (GLLA) – Leadership Advancement Program



The GLLA's Leadership Advancement Program focuses on concepts in the context of current issues and brings together current leaders in government, non-profits, and industry to broaden their perspectives about key sustainability issues and consider how leadership for the common good can influence Michigan's future. The program consists of 12 multi-day sessions, for a total of 40 days within 18 months, in locations throughout all of Michigan.

The MSU Extension Directors' office provides \$1250 to each association annually for professional development purposes. Typically, each association identifies one or two participants from their leadership to attend PILD.
