### OGEMAW COUNTY 4-H SENIOR SCHOLARSHIPS

If you have been an active Ogemaw 4-H member for at least 3 years and are interested in attending college, a university or trade school, please consider taking advantage of this scholarship opportunity offered by the Ogemaw County 4-H Council! The application form should be completed and either mailed to the address provided in the application packet or scanned and emailed to Ogemaw 4-H (MSUE.Ogemaw@msu.edu) by 4pm on the date of the deadline specified in the application (March 31st, 2023). Be sure to leave time to obtain the required recommendations!



These awards will be paid directly to the college/university to be used to assist in educational expenses. The scholarship committee will conduct personal interviews after the application deadline, so please be on the lookout for a letter and email with your scheduled interview date and time. ### You can volunteer in a variety of ways - short or long-term!


You can volunteer in a number of roles, but the common ones are....

- •4-H Club Leader (also called "traditional" leader, project leader): 4-H project leaders help guide the club's members in planning their annual club program, conducting club business, electing youth officers, and learning about/engaging with one or more 4-H projects. They often teach the educational component of the club program and engage with guest speakers. They help organize and facilitate a series of project lessons, usually 4 6 meetings or more. Project leaders help members complete project record books and prepare for events like achievement days or the county fair.
- •4-H Administrative Leader: 4-H administrative leaders help with club logistics and organization. They may manage the club inventory and financial records, enrollment, attendance, and coordinate guest speakers alongside the project leader(s). They may also take point on fundraisers, event planning, and assist with teaching club members about their projects alongside the project leader(s). This role is perfect for those that feel they have strong organizational and planning skills, and don't mind doing paperwork!
- •Short Term Volunteer (also called "resource volunteers"): Volunteers in this role lead an activity, assist with a program, or volunteer at any of our annual events. They may share a skill or interest they have with an existing club or after school program, or help out at an organized workshop. Or they may choose to be a chaperone or accompany a youth group to a special event or activity. Example: you want to volunteer to be a chaperone for 4-H Exploration Days
- •**SPIN club leader:** SPIN clubs are SPecial INterest clubs and only meet for a short time- generally not more than 6 meetings per year (8-9 hours per year). These clubs typically take on a single project with a small group of kids (at least 5 youth). Not as intense as a traditional leader, but every bit as rewarding similar to a resource leader, but this role takes on a club leadership in the short-term. *Example: you want to lead a 6-week summer SPIN Club about ice cream*
- •4-H Advisory Group Member: Individuals may participate as members of local 4-H advisory groups or special committees (i.e. the Livestock Committee). Committee members often have less direct involvement with youth and serve in more of an administrative role in the 4-H program. Example: you want to participate in the 4-H Council to help guide the growth of 4-H in the community

### **Role Description for 4-H Exploration Days**

#### Purpose:

To assist with providing a safe, nurturing environment in which youth participants can participate fully in a precollege experience.

#### Chaperones must.....

- Complete the MSU Extension Volunteer Selection Process, be accepted, enrolled in 4-HOnline, and in the Active Gold Volunteer Central activity status.
- Must complete 4-H Exploration Days Volunteer Orientation and 4-H Chaperone Training
- Arrive on site before the first youth in the delegation is expected to arrive, no later than 8 am if the delegation isn't coming all together, and remain on site until the last youth has been picked up or until excused by the lead chaperone
- Successfully complete all training prior to event, including 4-H Chaperone Module in Volunteer Central
- Participation and support of staff in Country Orientation meetings

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Provide direction, encouragement and support to all assigned youth within your county delegation
- Assist with check in and check out procedures with direction from the county Lead Chaperone.
- When chaperones are not on the assigned housing floor, they are expected to post a notice on their door informing the youth they are chaperoning where they can be easily found and send notice to the youth they are chaperoning through any additional methods that the county is using for communication (example: text messages, Remind, GroupMe).
- Conduct nightly room checks in coordination with Lead Chaperone.
- Work with county staff member or Lead Chaperone (when county staff are not present at event) for any behavior needs.
- Ensure youth participants are finding sessions, meals, and other activities at the event they are interested in.

- Conduct five youth and chaperone huddles throughout the event to your specific chaperone group up to eight youth. These mandatory meetings will give you a chance to touch base with youth after sessions, before and after evening activities, before bedtime, and just before check-out and departure.
- Serve as a session support for at least one session, if not serving as a session instructor. (See session support position description)
- During free time or during any non-session times, provide supervision and encouragement to participants and sign up to assist with free time support roles
- Be present for and assist the Lead Chaperone, as needed, with the following meetings during the event:
  - County orientation at the event
  - Any specific check-in times between participants and chaperones
- Touch base with the Lead Chaperone to share any questions or concerns participants encountered while checking in/checking out or throughout the event.

At Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience, teens learn how to change the world for the better through engagement in Michigan's state government and public policy process. The 4-H Capitol Experience program, scheduled for March 12-14, in Lansing, has been described by past participants as "amazing", "life-changing", and "an opportunity unlike any other".

### **World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute registrations due March 15!**

As millions across the globe deal with food insecurity, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute (WFP MIYI) offers young people an opportunity to be part of the solution. Held May 11 in East Lansing, or by participating from anywhere else using Zoom video/web conference AT MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY technology, the event seeks to inspire and prepare the next generation of global leaders to end world hunger.

Attendees will have the opportunity to share their ideas related to global food security with experts and other Michigan youth while learning how university faculty and staff members, researchers and students are working to address world hunger.

To participate, youth should be in grades 7-12 and register by the March 15 deadline. As part of the registration process, youth are required to prepare a two- to five-page research paper about a developing country and one of 20 key factors that affect food security. At the event, youth present and discuss their papers with other attendees and research and industry experts. They also participate in interactive activities related to global food challenges and engage with area experts to discuss solutions to global hunger and poverty.

The top performing students at the WFP MIYI will be selected to attend the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, in October. For more information, visit https://www.canr.msu.edu/wfpmiyi/. Registrations and papers are due March 15.


