#### Bird biosecurity reminders

With cases of highly pathogenic avian influenza on the rise, owners of poultry projects and other birds are encouraged to implement preventative measures. This includes keeping animals contained at their own facilities, as well as:

Preventing contact between domestic and wild birds by bringing them indoors or ensuring their area is enclosed.

Washing hands before and after handling birds and when moving between different coops.

Disinfecting boots and other gear when moving between coops.

Not sharing equipment or other supplies between coops or other farms.

Cleaning and disinfecting equipment and other supplies between uses.

Using well or municipal water as drinking water for birds.

Ensuring there is no contact between poultry feed/feed ingredients and wild birds or rodents.

Wearing clean clothing and footwear that has not been worn in a home coop into public venues.

If you suspect a bird in your flock may be sick with avian influenza, contact MDARD immediately at 800-292-3939 (daytime) or 517-373-0440 (after-hours). Signs of HPAI include unusual deaths, drop in egg production and significant decrease in water consumption.

Learning sessions and recreation are designed to:

- Increase teens' appreciation and enjoyment of the outdoors, natural resources, and science.
- Increase teens' knowledge about the Great Lakes, natural resources ecology and management issues.
- Develop strong attitudinal attachment to Michigan's unique natural resources and bioregional features.
- Foster scientifically rooted environmental stewardship.
- Develop and expand career and personal interests.
- Develop leadership skills and self-confidence.
- Increase social and academic skills needed for a successful transition to college and life as an adult.

#### Who should attend?

The camp is for teens aged 13 to 15, or going into 8th -10th grades in the fall, who are functioning at gradelevel or above. (We use the public school cut-off date for school-year eligibility which is that 2022 campers must be born before 12/01/2009 to be entering 8th grade in the fall.) **You don't need to be a 4-H member to attend.** 

Maximum camper capacity is 70 campers, so apply early to increase your chances of getting a spot. Registration will open in early May and spaces are limited!
