HORSE NEWS

If you plan to exhibit at any 4-H event this summer, your horse must have a negative <u>Coggins test</u>, and a copy of the test filed with the 4-H

office. Be sure to bring a copy before your first event! If you bring your horse to the Evart Fair, you will need a copy of the test at the time of unloading. Also, check with your veterinarian to see which vaccinations you should give your horse.

The <u>4-H Pleasure Point Shows</u> will be held on May 19, June 9, and July 14, at the Sheriff's Posse Grounds north of Reed City and June 30th at the Evart Fair Grounds. Each show begins at 9:00 a.m. If your club hasn't signed up to help with a show, contact Jacob asap. The funds raised from holding

these shows are used to benefit all horse members throughout the year, and all clubs are required to help with one show. Even if you or your horse is not ready to show, come and watch the show. It is a great learning experience!

The <u>4-H PEP Benefit shows</u> will be held on May 18, June 8, and July 13, at the Sheriff's Posse Grounds north of Reed City and June 29th at the Evart Fair Grounds. MARION FAIR (June 16-22)

The Marion Fair Set-up Wednesday June 12, 2018 starting at 6 p.m.

Entry day for animal exhibits and still exhibits will be on **Sunday June 16** this year (except dairy cattle.) Check the fair-book for exact times for your species.

<u>Camping</u> – Fair Superintendents and Board members must have their campers in by Saturday before fair. Any exhibitor who wishes to camp on the fair side of the river (under the trees by the track wall) may then put their camper in any open spot beginning Sunday morning. The fee remains \$50 for the week.

Market prices will be posted on the first day of Fair.

EVART FAIR (July 28-August 3)

<u>Small and Large Animal Sale</u>: Looking for youth volunteers to help serve and work during the animal sales. We are in need of large animal OLC youth to help during the small animal sale and small animal youth to help during the large animal sale. Please contact the office if you are able to help out. Remember, fair is a fun filled week were we all come together to help each other out.

The **<u>Pre-registration deadline</u>** for Evart is July 5. You may mail your registrations by that day, or bring them to the Fair Office by 5:00 p.m. on July 5. (Not the 4-H office!) Remember to use your Fair age (as of Jan 1, 2019) when you register. Camping reservations can be made beginning July 22.

Exhibitor Tags – Remember the exhibitor tags are electronic so once you entered your pre-registration, you must go to the fair office to pick up you tags. The fair office will not be mailing the tags to you.

A Fair Work-bee will be held for all 4-H members on Wednesday, July 24 at 7:00 p.m. If you plan to exhibit at the fair, plan to be at this work-bee! You have a responsibility to help with both set up and clean up. Your club or your family may also volunteer to help at the fairgrounds at any time this summer. Just contact the Fair Office at 734-5481 to see what needs to be done.

If you are doing a poster for an animal project for the fair, the size must be 28×22

Days on feed for Evart are: Beef 239 Lambs 85 Goats 85

Market Prices will be posted the first day of fair at weigh-in.

Final weigh-in (goat, sheep, swine) is on July 28, 2019 from 9am – 1pm and any swine not weighing 230-300 pounds will be sent home. Beef weigh-in is at 6 pm .

Rabbits and poultry will weigh in from 5 - 8 pm on Saturday July 27, 2019.



CADILLAC FAIR (August 11-17)

Pre-registration deadline is July 29, 2019. Mail entries by that date or bring them to the Fair Office on the 30th. Remember to use your Fair Age (as of January 1, 2019). Fair books should be out mid June 2019.
