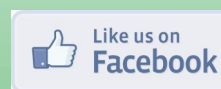

Michigan 4-H partners with MSU's Women's Leadership Institute to energize women leaders

Every day, in every way, women are leaders. To learn more about female leadership, 21 youth gathered together on September 24 to attend the Michigan State University (MSU) [Women's Leadership Institute](#) (WLI). An annual event now in its fourth consecutive year, the WLI is designed to empower women students with leadership aspirations.



A collaborative effort between MSU's College of Social Science, MSU alumni, professional women and students, the WLI seeks to ignite the passion of women leaders. Among the institute's executive board is Dr. Amy Bonomi, director of children and youth programming for MSU Extension. Bonomi worked to include high-school students for the first time in this year's event.

"One of the 2019 WLI themes was 'we're never not leaders' and we know youth are leaders in their own communities, every day," said Bonomi. "They're leaders in clubs, churches, schools, friend groups and even their families. So as we thought about this year's event, we knew it was the perfect time to invite high-schoolers to participate."

[Michigan 4-H](#) led the youth component of the event. Youth ages 14–19 were invited to attend a special pre-reception hosted by Bonomi and Dr. Erica Tobe, associate director of children and youth programming for MSU Extension. Several other members of MSU Extension's 4-H staff also supported the pre-reception, and MSU Athletics Chief of Staff Alan Haller and [MSU College of Agriculture and Natural Resources](#) (CANR) Dean Ron Hendrick delivered keynote addresses.

"Having the ability to listen to adults with higher experiences than what I have had so far in my life, and being able to identify and relate with the things they have gone through on their own leadership journeys was an opportunity like no other," said Savannah Mauk, an Eaton County 4-H'er.

After the keynote presentations, the youth interacted with the speakers, CANR and MSU Extension staff and each other to share their leadership stories. Following the reception, youth attended a WLI panel discussion at the Wharton Center, which featured world leaders Carolyn Woo, Tiffany L. Jones and Anne Whelan. Youth also participated in a pre-session in advance of the reception that discussed the themes of the evening and how to share their own leadership stories.

"The WLI was an awesome opportunity that challenged everyone, regardless of their stage in life, to be a better leader and develop their leadership skills," said Grace Schmidt, a 4-H'er from Livingston County. "I left the WLI feeling inspired to embrace authenticity in my own leadership," said another 4-H'er, Addy Battel of Huron County. "That experience is having lasting effects on my personal life."

Plans are already underway for another youth-focused event to be held in collaboration with the 2020 WLI.

On Dec. 3, Michigan 4-H is once again teaming up with Michigan State University in their Give Green Day campaign held in conjunction with Giving Tuesday. Beef Weigh-in for market beef projects for the Marion, Osceola County & Northern District Fair will be held on Saturday, November 23rd at the Marion Stockyard from 9am to noon. All beef must be weighed-in on this day to be eligible for the market sales at the Marion, Evert and Cadillac fairs. If you are purchasing your calf, be sure to ask that the seller tag your calf with the RFID ear tag, so that you won't have to order tags from MDA yourself. If your calf is homegrown, state law requires that you have the RFID tag in place as well. All calves will be tagged with the 4-H tag. **All calves MUST BE dehorned with no horns present at the time of beginning weigh-in and castrated.**

Fair News

All **fair ages** are determined by January 1, 2020, the same as 4-H age! Cadillac will be for members ages 6-18; Evert will be ages 6-19; and Marion will be ages 6-19. This could mean that a 5 year old eligible to join 4-H would not be able to show and sell an animal at the fair until the next year when he/she would be 6, both 4-H and Fair age.

General News

The \$20 per member, \$60 for a family of 3 or more, 4-H Participation Fee should be collected at your club meeting and turned into the 4-H Office at one time by your club leader. If unable to pay your participation fee at your club meeting the 4-H Office will accept individual payments.

The **Bad Toads 4-H Shooting Sports Club** will begin January 7, 2020, at the Reed City Middle School Cafeteria. Youth ages 8 - 19 as of January 1, 2020 are welcome to join. The league will run for 12 weeks, and the cost is \$10 for the whole 12 weeks and \$20 for the 4-H Participation Fee if you have not already paid in another 4-H club. You will need to enroll online before the first meeting in January. If you have questions on enrollment contact the 4-H Office.

38th Annual Breakfast with Santa is Saturday, December 7th, 2019. This is a Kettunen Center's largest community event; it is our opportunity to give back to the community. Families are welcome to come enjoy breakfast, visit with Santa, try a craft, enjoy face painting, entertainment, games, and a photo booth (bring your own camera). Any youth or volunteer wanting to attend a Kettunen Center workshop or other workshop, must complete the Workshop Prepay Form and Scholarship Request Form prior to registering. If you pay online please submit the scholarships request form for a refund for the cost of your initial registration cost, the cost of the workshop prior to attending. Remember youth and volunteers may attend up to two workshops with reimbursement through the 4-H Council.

Remember...If the school district where a 4-H meeting is scheduled is **closed** due to bad weather then the meeting will be **cancelled**. Also, check "Osceola County Michigan 4-H" on Facebook for updates and cancellations.

Judy Mohr Life Skills Contest - this is open to any youth that is interested. Youth will fill out an application for Turkey, Poultry, Rabbit, Goat, Beef, Sheep and Swine, then submit it to the 4-H Office by the dates found below. The Selection Committee will go through the applications and pick individuals that will go to the next step by participating in a non-formal interview. After the interview one recipient will be awarded for each species and that species must be shown and sold at any of the three fairs. If you are interested please contact the 4-H Office to get the application. **Deadlines for application are: Turkey - December 20, 2019; Poultry, Rabbit, Goat, Beef, Sheep and Swine - February 1, 2020.**
