Summer is nearly behind us and we are ready to embrace a new year of 4-H. We are doing our annual round-up of new 4-H volunteers and members. If you know someone who might like to get involved, please invite them. We are already in the process of getting several new 4-H volunteers through our 4-H Volunteer Selection Process which has gotten very streamlined over the past two years. And membership fees are currently waived, so youth can enroll in 4-H at no cost.

We are one of only about a dozen counties engaging in the 4-H CrowdPower campaign (the only public funding campaign approved by MSU) that gives people a way to show financial support for our local 4-H program. The Council has compiled a list of programs to support, backing local ideas with action. We have an energetic 4-H Council, led by President Samantha Karoub, a busy 11th grader who makes time to work alongside the rest of the Council to help the 4-H program continue to grow and evolve. They understand that 4-H is a locally owned and driven program that becomes what local members make of it.

Speaking of a powerful and growing group, the newly established Roscommon County 4-H Interstate Exchange Club is gaining lots of local support. Just last Saturday, this group washed several dozen cars and raised over \$600 in about three hours, The money will help pay for their trip to Idaho next summer (see page 4). Thank you to those who came out and showed their support.

Michigan 4-H Foundation reopens 2021-22 grant cycle

The Michigan 4-H Foundation recently reopened their grant and award opportunities for the 2021-2022 season. Open to 4-H volunteer leaders, members and staff, the grants and awards support local 4-H clubs and county programs, as well as recognize members of the 4-H community. All applications are due September 9.

Opportunities include:

- Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants of \$1,000. These grants are awarded to support development of a new program or initiative or to strengthen, enhance or expand a current program that is making a difference.
- 4-H On-Target Grants of \$500. These grants support 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports.
- 4-H Educational Garden Grants of \$1,000. These grants support the creation of local 4-H educational gardens in Michigan.
- Michigan Farm Bureau 4-H Excellence in Agriculture Award (includes \$1,000 grant). This award recognizes the outstanding achievements of 4-H agricultural volunteers that have exhibited excellence in 4-H youth education and leadership development.

Indoor masking reminder



In August, MSU issued new guidance for the MSU community. Until further notice. attendees at any indoor **MSU Extension or** Michigan 4-H program or event are required to wear a face covering. This includes 4-H meetings and other volunteer-led events. Unless they have a medical exemption, face coverings must be worn by everyone in attendance over age 2 regardless of vaccination status.

For the purpose of MSU Extension or Michigan 4-H events and programs, indoor events are considered those in an enclosed building with limited airflow. Barns and other outbuildings that have multiple doors that can be fully opened to maximize air flow are considered an outdoor, open air facility.
