2. **Must** have the signature of a **club leader** indicating you are a member in good standing.
3. **Must be typed or neatly printed in ink with correct spelling and grammar. This is VERY important!!!**
4. Must have completed at least **two** years in the area for which you are applying.
5. **Junior participants must be 10 as of January 1st of current year. Seniors must be 15 and no older than 19 by January 1st of current year.**
6. 4-H participants may enter a maximum of **three** project areas. Use a different form for each project area.
7. Criteria for judging will be based on member's citizenship, leadership and involvement in local, regional, state and national activities.
8. Each participant will receive a participation certificate providing they have met all of the above qualification.
9. **The deadline for receiving applications is October 23, 2020. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
