Record books are required for all project areas. Market Project books will require at least a "B" rating to be eligible for the sale.

YQCA (Youth Quality Care Assurance) is a certification class that covers proper care, agriculture advocacy, and life skills that enhance and ensure education in the proper care of your animals. You are able to complete the training in person or Online. Record Keeping is essential in our life skills development.
