Re: 2021 Updates



This is a quick update on the changes that will take place for the 2021 fair season. Should you have questions, please feel free to contact the MSUE office at 269-467-5521. **PLEASE NOTE THAT CHANGES MAY OCCUR DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.**

- Countywide tagging/weigh-in dates will be **Tuesday, June 8 or Thursday, June 10 at the St. Joseph County Fairgrounds, 5:00 - 7:00 p.m.** All market beef/dairy beef, and feeder steer animals, including carcass animals, **must attend** the countywide tagging. This **does** include feeder steers. **Social distancing will be enforced. All animals must stay remain on the trailers until told to unload. All members and adults must also remain in their vehicles until told to unload. Masks are required for all persons at weigh-in events. Superintendents have the right to refuse services the day of weigh-in if above is not adhered to.**
- Beef exhibitors may participate in the "family" tagging policy that was voted on by the beef leaders at the post-fair meeting. Each family member must indicate on their registration form if they are participating in "family" tagging.
- Ownership of beef animals; Each 4-H member must remain in possession of their beef animals after tagging on Thursday, June 10, 2021 and must house their animal(s) within a 25 mile radius of members home address. If an animal is determined to be housed over the 25 mile radius of the members home address and is in violation determined by the beef superintendent or by MSUE staff, that animal will be disqualified for exhibition at the St. Joseph County Fair.
- Carcass Sunday: All set up of cattle equipment, bedding, and delivery of tack will only take place **PRIOR** to 11:00 a.m. or **AFTER** 4:00 p.m.
- Carcass animals **MUST** be broke to lead or will be disqualified at the discretion of the Beef Superintendent and or MSU Extension staff.
- Beef Carcass hanging evaluation contest will begin at 6:00pm.
- If a beef steer is disqualified from the carcass contest, the member may request the steer to be shipped with other steers for butcher, the member will be responsible for all expenses of processing and steer will not be entered into the carcass contest.
- County Bred and Raised forms are due to the MSU Extension office by 5:00 p.m., Friday, May 7, 2021. All forms will be date stamped by the MSU Extension office.
- Check in time at fair will be from **8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.** at the beef barn for **all** beef animals. This includes market beef, dairy market beef, feeder steers, and breeding stock.
- *****Dress code for Interview and Show:** Long pants (no holes, rips, or tears), Collared/dress short or long sleeve shirt. NO Sleeveless shirts. Leather shoe/boots
- Written evaluation books (forms) will be optional for the Beef project. There **will be** an interview process. Each member is required to do the interview evaluation to complete the beef project. Sign up times will be available at fair check in on Saturday, September 18, 2021.
- *****NEW FOR 2021: Each Beef exhibitor will be required to participate in the Beef Skill-A-Thon. The Skill-A-Thon will take place on Sunday, September 19, 2021. Location will be in the Henningsen Show Arena.**
- Dairy Market Steers may be a cross bred animal of two of the following breeds: Holstein, Jersey, Brown Swiss, Ayrshire, Guernsey, Lineback, and Dutch Belt.
- Market Steers and Market Heifers will compete together for Rate of Gain in 2021.
- The beef show order will be: showmanship (oldest to youngest), dairy market steers, market steers, market heifers, and county bred and raised, champion drive, breeding stock (4-H, open)



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- 4-H members may tag both a dairy market steer and a feeder steer. Member may also bring both animals to fair. If member does bring both a market dairy steer and feeder steer to fair, only the market steer may be used as showmanship animal and the only animal sold at auction.
- **Electronic Identification (EID) Tags**
 1. All cattle moving to a show, sale, or exhibition are required to have an official radio frequency identification device (RFID) ear tag. Exhibitors may call CentralStar Cooperative at 1-888-203-3398 to order RFID tags at a cost of \$2.42 per tag.
 2. All out-of-state cattle exhibited in Michigan shall be tagged with an official radio frequency identification device (RFID) ear tag. Tags can be ordered by calling Rise’ with RJ Matthews Co. at 330-834-3000.
 3. All cattle purchased in the State of Michigan, by law, must have an EID tag.

General Rules of Interest

1. There are four different types of 4-H market cattle that can be exhibited in 4-H classes at the St. Joseph County Grange Fair: *Beef market steers, beef market heifers, dairy market steers and dairy feeder steers*. A given member may register all four types of market cattle with the MSU Extension office.
2. **Dehorning:** All **market and breeding stock cattle** must be clean-polled/dehorned with an allowance of 1 ½” regrowth at fair in order to be exhibited in 4-H classes at the fair.
3. Beef/dairy beef/feeder steers with physical defects (i.e. ruptured navel, abscess, etc.) will be ineligible for exhibition in 4-H/FFA & Other Youth classes at fair.
4. Feed and water buckets/pans must be removed from the stall as soon as the animal has finished eating/drinking. Also, stalls must be cleaned daily (removing wet and manured bedding). The 4-H member is responsible for monitoring when the animal is done eating/drinking and removing buckets/pans accordingly as well as cleaning the stall(s). Failure to follow these rules may lead to “yellow/red-tagging” the exhibit. If a member receives two yellow tags and one red tag his/her project animal will be sent home and all awards/premiums relating to that animal will be revoked. (See “yellow/red tag” rule in the St. Joseph County 4-H Fair book).
5. All exhibitors are required to compete in Fitting & Showmanship classes showing their own project animal.
6. **All beef animals will have a destination on file from the auction by 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 25, 2021 or the animal will be shipped for resale.**
