Re: 2023 4-H Sheep Updates

This is a quick update on the events that will take place for the 2023 fair season within the sheep department. Should you have questions, please feel free to contact the MSU Extension office at 269-467-5511. Please note that the information contained in this letter is subject to change.

NEW for 2023:

- All sheep exhibitors are subject to receiving random farm visits conducted by the specie Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent.
- Possession: Each 4-H member must remain in possession of their animals after initial tagging/weigh-in. If animal is determined to be in violation by the specie Superintendent, that animal will be disqualified unless special permission is granted by the Superintendent and/or MSU Extension <u>prior</u> to moving animal to another location.
- Market lambs weighing less than the 100 lb. required minimum weight are ineligible for exhibition at the fair and will be sent home at check-in.
 - Exceptions: If a ewe lamb is underweight, it may cross over to the breeding stock class if the exhibitor is dually registered for both breeding stock and market class prior to fair.
 - Underweight carcass lambs will still be processed, but will not be eligible for placing. Carcass exhibitors will still be required to attend hanging evaluation for educational purposes.

Reminders:

- Initial Tagging Dates: Countywide tagging and weigh-in dates will be Tuesday, June 6, 2023 or Thursday, June 8, 2023 at the St. Joseph County Fairgrounds, 5:00-7:00p.m. Market lambs MUST attend one of these.
- Michigan Department of Agriculture (MDA) is requiring all lambs that are moved off the farm for sale or exhibition to be ear tagged with a USDA Scrapies ID tag. Anyone purchasing lambs should make sure the seller has tagged them prior to sale. If you raise lambs from your own herd you should contact the MDA at 1-800-292-3939 to get a premises identification number. Once you have the premises number call the USDA at 517-324-5290 to order your free tags and applicator so that you can tag your lambs prior to the initial weigh-in on June 6 or 8. Do not delay in ordering your tags from the MDA; it will take some time to receive them.
- All 4-H livestock members/clubs will be held responsible for setting up their
 project pen/stall and decorations before fair, as well as cleaning and tearing down
 their project pen/stall at the end of fair. Individuals or clubs may be assessed a
 \$50.00 fine for failure to do so.

- All Market lambs (including Carcass Contest) must be 100 lbs. or more at check-in on Friday, September 15, 2023 or Saturday, September 16, 2023. All Sheep will be weighed at the time of unloading. There will be no reweighing of animals.
- All animals must be checked in by the exhibitor or an immediate family member unless prior arrangements are made in writing and filed at the MSU Extension office 24 hours in advance of check-in times at the fair.
- All 4-H Livestock <u>MUST</u> have their Pen Stall Label cards above their pen by Sunday, September 17, 2023 at 12:00 noon. Failure to do so may result in a yellow tag.
- Market lambs must be rough shorn before they arrive to the fairgrounds for check-in.
- Check the 2023 St. Joseph County 4-H Fair Book (Department 6) for additional information and rules.
