Express Pass

Passes and Exhibit Tags

One of the first things 4-H members need to do when they arrive at the fair is pick up an envelope containing their <u>fair admission pass</u> and/or still project <u>exhibit tags</u> on Saturday, September 18, 2021, from 8:30 am - 12:00 pm or 1:00 - 4:00 pm in building #46. No passes will be distributed <u>after</u> the 4:00 pm deadline on Sunday.

Fair Admission Passes: 4-H members only receive fair passes if they exhibit a project at the fair. In addition, <u>only</u> members <u>11-19 years old</u> will receive fair passes, since all youth ages 10 and under are admitted free.

4-H <u>livestock exhibitor</u> car and driver passes are issued <u>one (1) per 4-H family</u> to those families who need to enter the fairgrounds on a daily basis to feed and care for their animals. This pass will be distributed by the Fair Management at the "red trailer" across from barn #44. One-day car and driver passes will be available upon request (at the rate of one/family/ event) for 4-H members who are <u>not</u> eligible to receive 4-H livestock exhibitor passes but who <u>will be</u> participating in one or more of the following non-animal activities at fair:

- 4-H Animal Project Demonstrations scheduled for <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September 22, 2021</u>, beginning at 3:00 pm at the 4-H Photo Wall.
- ◆ 4-H Still Project Demonstrations/Illustrated Talks/Performances and Style Revue scheduled for <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September 22, 2021</u>, at 11:00 a.m. 5:00 pm, location TBD.

4-H Leader Passes: Active registered 4-H leaders will receive a fair pass *UPON REQUEST* from the "red trailer" across from barn #44. Individuals registered to serve as leaders, but who have been identified as <u>inactive</u> by club organizational leaders in terms of fulfilling their responsibilities as leaders will NOT receive fair passes. It is the responsibility of 4-H club organizational leaders to see that all project leaders are registered in the St. Joseph County MSU Extension office. All leader passes <u>MUST</u> be picked up by 5:00 pm on Sunday, September 19.

Passes may be picked up at the RED trailer located in front of the 4-H office at the Fair Grounds. During the following times:

- <u>Saturday, September 11, 2021, 12:30 p.m. 3:30 p.m.</u>
- <u>Sunday, September 12, 2021, 10:30 am 4:00 pm</u>
- Friday, September 17, 2021, 4:00 8:00 pm



<u>Saturday, September 18, 2021, 8:30 am - 4:00 pm</u>

4-H members who will be exhibiting in the 4-H Dog Show or Rabbit Evaluations on Saturday, September 18, <u>and</u> who also need to have still projects evaluated on that date may, <u>if</u> their situation meets the conditions stated in the next paragraph, pick up a special 4-H wristband in the 4-H Fair office (located between buildings #43 & #44) that will serve as an "express pass" for still project evaluation. The "express pass" will allow members to be moved to the front of still project evaluation lines.

Express Pass Criteria: Express passes will be distributed <u>only</u> when special access to still project exhibit evaluation is <u>absolutely necessary</u> to ensure that the 4-H member in question can complete participation in both the 4-H Dog Show/Rabbit Evaluations and Still Exhibit Project Evaluation during the times allotted for these activities.

Early Check-in for Dairy, Horse and Swine Members

Any Dairy Cattle, Horse and/or Swine member that would like to bring in their animal(s) early may do so on Friday, September 17, 2021, during the following times: Dairy Cattle (not dairy market or dairy feeder) 6:00-10:00 pm., Horse 4:00-8:00 pm., Swine 4:00-7:00 pm. Superintendents will be on hand to check tag numbers. Animals should be clean and <u>tags easy to read</u>. If tags are not clean and easily read; member, animal, and vehicle will be moved to the end of the unloading line. All Swine will be weighed as unloaded from trailer. Note: There is <u>no</u> reweighing.

Market Livestock Weigh-In

Official "weight" of a given market livestock project animal (for show and sale purposes) will be determined when the animal is weighed in at the fair (see weigh-in schedule list). The weight of your animal at this time will determine the specific market "weightclass" your animal will be entered in for competition at fair.

Attention! Market livestock will be weighed <u>ONE TIME ONLY</u>. Market beef cattle, dairy beef, swine, and rabbits must be weighed <u>before</u> being housed.

Poultry	= Friday, 4:00 - 7:00 pm
Rabbits	= Friday, 4:00 - 8:00 pm
Steers	= Saturday, 8:00 am - 1:00 pm
Swine	= Friday, 4:00 - 7:00 pm and Saturday, 8:00 am - 12:00 pm
Lambs	= Saturday, 8:00 am - 1:00 pm
Goats	= Saturday, 8:00 am - 1:00 pm

***New for 2021:

Beef:

*Each beef exhibitor will be required to participate in a Beef Skill-A-Thon. The Skill-A-Thon will take place on Sunday, September 19, 2021, 2-5 pm. in the Show Arena.

Swine:

*No Ractopamine products may be fed or given to ANY animal at the fair. A signed affidavit will be required before any pigs cross the scale.

* The St. Joseph County Grange Fair is now a NON-TERMINAL fair. If a member chooses to take their swine animal home (as long as it is not the Grand/ Reserve Grand Barrow or Gilt) they may do so. It still needs to go through the sale and buyer will determine destination.

Sheep:

*Skill-A-Thon will be required for ALL sheep exhibitors on Sunday, September 19 from 2-5 pm in the Show Arena.

*Sheep exhibitors may use Natural/dry mulch or shavings for bedding purposes. <u>Breeding stock</u> sheep may also use straw.

Indoor masking reminder



In August, MSU issued new quidance for the MSU community. Until further notice, attendees at any indoor MSU Extension or Michigan 4-H program or event are required to wear a face covering. This includes 4-H meetings and other volunteer-led events. Unless they have a medical exemption, face coverings must be worn by everyone in attendance over age 2 regardless of vaccination status.

For the purpose of MSU Extension or Michigan 4-H events and programs, indoor events are considered those in an enclosed building with limited airflow. Barns and other outbuildings that have multiple doors that can be fully opened to maximize air flow are considered an outdoor, open air facility.

2021 Health Requirements for Livestock

The following is a summary of important animal heath information for animals brought to exhibit at the 2021 St. Joseph County Grange Fair. All Cattle (Market & Breeding Stock) - Must have an official radio frequency

identification device (RFID) ear tag.

Goats - Have official identification (Scrapies tags) in the ear or tail of animal. Horses and Ponies - All equine, except foals under six months and nursing their dam, entered in a fair, exhibition, exposition, or show must test negative to an official Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test within the current calendar year. (Coggins Test) Have original on hand with you, a copy should accompany your fair registration form. Rabbit - No paperwork or vaccinations required at this time.

Sheep - All sheep moved within Michigan shall be identified with official USDA Scrapies program identification tags prior to movement off the farm. Contact the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) at (517) 324-5294 for ear tags.

Swine - Have clean animals and be sure ear tags are readable and clean when entering fair. A NEUES ID tag is also required of all Swine. If your swine does not have a NEUES ID tag or 840 tag in the ear, one will be put in prior to penning the animal at the fair for 2021.

2021 Dairy Feeder Steer Vaccination Requirements

- Step 1 First vaccination must be received at the June weigh-in to help protect against infectious diseases.
- Step 2 "Booster" the calf two to four weeks later (following the Step 1 vaccination) with the same type of modified live vaccine used in Step 1.

Step 3 - Nasalgen will need to be administered to all steers. 4-H Club leaders will be responsible to administer Nasalgen between August 17 - 31, 2021.

Watering Livestock Reminder

Due to the potential for transmission of communicable livestock diseases through use of shared drinking water containers, <u>no group watering tanks</u> will be allowed at the fair.

In addition, <u>all</u> animals are to be <u>watered</u> either in their <u>pen/stall</u> or at the appropriate <u>wash rack</u>, and the wash rack **cleaned up** if necessary (i.e. any manure left behind by your animal properly disposed of). This rule is necessary due to the problems with "water holes" and mud that are created when livestock are watered next to water faucets at the ends of barns.

Miracle of Birth Tent

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The Birthing tent coordinator is looking for volunteers to help staff the tent during the fair. Your responsibilities would include but are not limited to:

- ° Encourage and show visitors where to wash their hands after petting animals.
- Keep area clean of all feces.
- Do not let anyone pet animals that appear ill.

It is requested that you volunteer for a 3-hour shift any time between 8 a.m. and 9 p.m. during the week of the fair (Sunday, September 19 - Saturday, September 25). For more information and/or to sign up for a volunteer time call Steve Wolf at 269-254-5488.

Still Exhibit Judging

All 4-H still exhibits MUST be checked in and evaluated on <u>Saturday, September 18, 2021,</u> during one of the following evaluation periods:

Morning Evaluation: 9:00 am - 12:00 pm

Afternoon Evaluation: 1:00 - 4:00 pm

There will be an <u>hour lunch break</u> for judges and judging clerks from 12:00 pm - 1:00 pm. Still project exhibit buildings will be closed during the lunch break. Member access to the exhibit buildings will be limited as necessary starting at 11:30 am to help ensure that judges wrap things up in time for lunch.

The Still Exhibit Evaluation procedure is as follows:

1. Pick up an envelope containing your <u>4-H member gate admission pass</u> and still project <u>exhibit tags</u> in during the noted times above. Location TBD.

2. Report to the EAST end of the appropriate still project exhibit building. An <u>Evaluation</u> <u>Traffic Controller</u> will assist members with finding the right stations.

3. <u>4-H members only</u> will be admitted into the buildings during evaluation times. Each member exhibiting "still projects" will receive a **one-on-one evaluation**.

4. Public viewing of the still exhibit barns start at 1:00 pm on Sunday, September 19, 2021.

Still Exhibit Unloading

Unloading of still exhibits may be done next to the barns; however, your vehicle MUST be moved immediately after unloading is complete (do not leave your vehicle unattended). If your vehicle is left in the unloading zone it will be towed to the back of the southeast parking lot. Please make sure you are not in an animal unloading line.

Style Revue

The *4-H Style Revue* will be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September 22</u>, <u>2021</u>, <u>at 4:50 pm</u>, Location TBD. All 4-H members who will be exhibiting a completed Sewing, Knitting, Crocheting and/or Wardrobe Personalization project at fair are eligible to participate in the Style Revue.

Members may model a combination of project exhibits if desired. In addition, members may also use purchased accessories to complete or accentuate their outfit and/or a "prop" to help "set off" the particular type of garment(s) being modeled.

4-H Style Revue participants will be divided into two divisions according to age (8-13 year olds and 14-19 year olds). Members will be judged on their <u>modeling ability</u> and <u>garment fit</u>, and will receive an A, B or *C* rating and premium accordingly.

Demonstrations & Performances

All 4-H <u>still project</u> demonstrations, performances, public speaking presentations and illustrated talks will be given on **Wednesday**, **September 22**, **2021**, 1-5 pm. Location TBD.

All 4-H <u>animal project</u> demonstrations will take place on Wednesday, September 22, 2021, 3:00 - 4:00 pm at the 4-H Photo wall.

Note: One table and one easel will be provided at each of the above noted locations.

Demonstration/Performance "Times": Sign-up for "times" will be conducted on a <u>first-come, first-served</u> basis in building #46 on Saturday, September 18 from 8:30 am - 12:00 pm and 1:00 - 4:00 pm <u>or</u> in the 4-H Office between buildings #43 & #44 on Sunday, September 19, 2021, from 8:00 am - 5:00 pm

Plan to be at your designated "presentation" location <u>at least 15 minutes early</u>. Be sure to bring all the equipment you need.

Sewing, Knitting, Crocheting & Wardrobe Personalization

 Members will <u>not</u> be asked to change into their garments for evaluation at fair.
 Sewing and <u>Wardrobe</u> <u>Personalization</u> project members are reminded to <u>bring garments on a hanger(s)</u> so that they are ready to be "hung" on the exhibit building wall for display purposes.

4-H members receiving trophies or special awards in still and/or livestock projects may report to the **4-H Fair Photo Wall** located between barns #23 and #24 from 5:00 - 6:00 pm starting on <u>Monday, September 20</u> and running through <u>Friday, September 24</u> for "photo opportunities" with reporters from area newspapers.

4-H Photo Information Sheet: All award-winning 4-H members seeking a "photo opportunity" <u>must</u> report to the 4-H Fair Office to obtain and complete a *4-H Photo Information Sheet* <u>prior</u> to reporting to the Fair Photo Wall.

"<u>Photo trophies</u>" have been set aside for use in photo sessions with local media. These trophies have blank engraving plates and "generic" figures on top. The trophies will be on loan from our trophy supplier. A volunteer "<u>photo session coordinator</u>" will be on hand each day that photo sessions are scheduled to assist the reporters/photographers. The photo session coordinator will be responsible for: Transporting the "photo trophies" to the photo session location at the <u>4-H Fair Photo Wall</u> by 4:45 pm, and returning the trophies to the 4-H Fair office at the end of the photo session. Assisting photographers from local newspapers in coordinating an orderly flow of interested members through the photo process. Your cooperation with this system of handling photo opportunities with our local newspapers and fair photographer will be greatly appreciated.

Ag-Citing Experience Volunteers Needed

With fair *fast* approaching we are finding that we are still in need of volunteers for the 30th annual Ag-Citing Experience. The dates for the program are Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday of fair.

For those of you who are not aware of "Ag-Citing Experience", it is an educational program that gives 3rd grade students an opportunity to learn about farm animals and agriculture. The classes are bussed to the fairgrounds where they will be lead on a tour of designated animals and field/vegetable crops. The animals they will be learning about this year are cattle, goats/sheep, swine, poultry and rabbits. Note: Knowledge is not necessary in these areas in order to volunteer.

Sign-up has begun and we are in need of a few tours guides, a lot of resource people.

Golf/ATV/Off Road Vehicles Policy:

Golf Carts/ATV/Off Road Vehicles will NOT be allowed for recreational use. Any vehicle, if on the fairgrounds, shall require a permit at a cost of \$50.00 purchased at the fair office.

- The Fair office must have a proof of liability insurance for all vehicles before a permit can be issued. (form available on the Fair website. www.centrevillefair.com)
- Drivers must be 16 years or older with a valid drivers' license. Must have copy filed with fair office.
- Permit must be displayed on vehicle and be visible.
- NO more than the allotted number of people can ride on the vehicle than the available seating
- A map will be given to each person showing the routes allowed to travel based on type of permit given and time of day.
- Any violation to these rules may result in the removal of the vehicle from the fairgrounds.
- Lights must be on the front and rear with proper intensity and must be operating after dark.

Exception: persons handicapped and/or disabled will be allowed to have batterypowered wheelchairs and/or battery-powered three-wheeled scooters.

Auction



New for 2021!

The purpose of the still project auction:

- To entice more interest in 4-H youth participation in still project areas because of the opportunity of financial gain.
- To give the 4-H still project exhibitors the "marketing" experience like the livestock exhibitors have, such as face-to-face experience with potential buyers, writing skills in the form of buyer letters and Thank-you notes, and the character building skills of presentation in the sale ring.
- To have the means for funds specifically earmarked for Still Project area development and Exhibit improvements by assessing a small commission.

Criteria for Still Project Auction Entry:

Entry is completely voluntary and project must be on approved list set by committee

- 1. Exhibitor must have shown in that project area at least once before.
- 2. Project must be entered in current year fair and receive an "A" rating.
- 3. **4-H member MUST take project through the auction.**
- Auction entry form must be completed and turned into the 4-H office by Monday, September 20 at noon to allow committee enough time to verify placings and completeness of application.
- 5. If project was awarded a trophy/award, the appropriate thank you note must be submitted with the Auction Entry form. Committee will record this on 4-H office records.
- 6. Project may be pulled from auction with a written request by exhibitor and parent/ guardian no later than Friday, September 24 at 5:00 p.m.
- 7. Items entered in Auction will be moved to barn #44 on Monday afternoon.
- 8. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to contact at least three potential buyers in writing and/or in person to attend the auction.
- Auction will be held in Still Exhibit Barn #44 at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 25, 2021. Thank you cards for auction items must be turned in to the 4-H office by Friday, October 1, 2021. No monies will be released to the exhibitor until thank you note is turned in.

"Thank you" note sets may be purchased at the 4-H Fair office starting on Sunday, September 19, 2021, and running through Saturday, September 25 during regularly scheduled office hours for as long as supplies last.

At <u>\$2.00 each</u>, these attractive "thank you" note sets are a great buy for use in writing "thank you" notes to trophy, plaque and special award donors and market livestock buyers! (However, the use of "4-H" thank you note stationary is <u>not</u> required.)

Trophy and special award recipients are <u>required</u> to write and submit a "thank you" note for the donor(s) of each trophy/special award received. The "thank you" note is then exchanged by the member for his/her trophy/special award. "Thank you" notes must be submitted in a <u>stamped envelope</u> (which has both the <u>donor's address</u> and the award recipient's <u>return address</u> neatly written on the envelope). Note: If the "thank you" note is for a buyer, write on the back of the envelope what species of yours they purchased.

Attention: Thank you notes (including envelopes) should be written using an <u>ink pen</u> to end up with the most professional and neat-looking results! In addition, the 4-H Youth Program Coordinator reserves the right to refuse "thank you" notes submitted with sloppily and/or incompletely addressed envelopes and/or dirt-smudged envelopes.

Donor Name/Address Information: The trophy/special award donor's name will be printed on a "donor identification card" that will be attached to each trophy/special award. A list of all trophies/plaques/special awards and the corresponding donors (including the donor's complete address and the name of the "contact person" for business donors) will be posted on the A-frame in the middle of building #43.

Buyer Name/Address Information: The buyer's name and number will be written on a sheet of paper that is filled out immediately following the sale of your animal. A list of all buyers (including complete address and "contact person" for businesses) will be posted on the A-frame in the middle of building #43.

Be sure to put some real <u>time and thought</u> into composing your note. Hastily written notes are <u>not</u> well received by donors and buyers. It is <u>up to you</u> as an award winner to express your appreciation in such a way that donors are encouraged to <u>continue donating</u> trophies and special awards in the future. Without the support of our donors, the awarding of fair trophies and awards would not be possible.

Trophies & Special Awards Pick-Up

Trophies and special awards may be picked up on <u>Saturday, September 25, 2021,</u> 10:00 - 11:00 p.m. and <u>Sunday, September 26, 2021,</u> 9:00 am- 12:00 pm in building #43.

To pick-up your trophy you must submit a stamped and sealed, thank you note written to the donor with the correct address and your return address. Thank you notes with pre-stamped envelopes will be for sale in the 4-H office for \$2.00 each during regularly scheduled hours. A listing of all the donors, with correct spelling address etc. will be posted in building #43.

Going home: Biosecurity tips for animals that went to the county fair

Animals exhibited at the county fair that will return to their home herds pose a significant biosecurity risk to the animals left at home. Follow these steps after the fair has ended to protect everyone.

Animals that have been exhibited during the county fair are likely near and dear to their exhibitors' hearts. After all, they spent countless hours training and preparing their animal for the show at the fair. We protect them from everything before the show season, but do we give enough thought about what happens when they go home? Each time an animal is taken out of its home environment and exhibited, there is a certain amount of risk for exposure to

illness.

<u>Michigan State University Extension</u> offers these biosecurity steps exhibitors can take to protect their show animals and those that were left at home after the fair has ended.

- Keep animals that were at the fair separate from animals that were not for 28 30 days. If at all possible, do not allow nose-to-nose contact and provide as much distance between animals.
- Disinfect all buckets, feeders, tools and footwear that was at the fair.
- Throw away any feed or hay that was at the fair.
- Always wear clean clothes and footwear. Boot coverings may be helpful when caring for animals.
- Take care of animals that stayed home from the show first, and animals that were at the show second. Do not go back and forth between animals as this increases the risk of cross-contamination.
- Do not eat or drink in the barn.
- Observe animals daily for signs and symptoms of illness, such as:
 - Obvious pain or discomfort.
 - Decrease in appetite and water intake.
 - Fever.
 - Lethargy.
 - Diarrhea or changes in consistency in manure.
 - Discharge from nasal cavity or eyes.
 - Overall weakness.

If you notice any of the above symptoms, please call your veterinarian immediately.

Care of animals after the fair is critical. Exhibited animals were exposed to animals from other farms, fair goers who may not have washed their hands in between various species of animals, and potentially a lot of stress. By following these steps, you can help keep all of your animals safe and healthy.
