St. Joseph County 4-H High Point Award

- A. Awards will be for Champion and Reserve Champion in the following age groups: 15-19 years old, 12-14 years old, and 8-11 years old.
- B. Participants must sign up one (1) one-horse/one-rider combination. Registration forms must be turned in to the St. Joseph County MSU Extension office by May 1 of current program year.
- C. Fair and Horse Council sponsored show classes are counted for the award. The top five (5) placings will count for the award. Classes must be selected on the registration form. Classes to choose from are: Bareback, Horsemanship, Hunt Seat Equitation, Hunt Seat Pleasure, Saddle Seat Equitation, Saddle Seat Pleasure, Showmanship, Trail, Western Pleasure, and Western Riding.
- D. Points are tabulated as follows and are not pro-rated: Six (6) placings for Horse Council sponsored shows and eight (8) placings for fair. In the event of a tie, the committee will count the number of 1st places received. If a tie remains, 2nd places will be counted and so on.
- E. Awards change each year. Examples: Leather Horse Halter, Clothing Bag.
- F. Six different donors that can change year by year no long term donation obligation.
- G. Points will be counted by the 4-H Horse Council tabulation/point committee. 4-H Horse Council President will confirm all tallied points.
- H. Walk/Trot classes do not count toward this award.
