4-H COUNTY & FAIR NEWS

PASSES AND EXHIBIT TAGS

One of the first things 4-H members need to do when they arrive at the fair is pick up an envelope containing their fair admission pass and/or still project exhibit tags on Saturday, September 16, 2023, from 8:30 am - 12:00 pm or 1:00 - 4:00 pm in a **pop-up next to** building #46. No passes will be distributed after the 4:00 pm deadline on Sunday.

Fair Admission Passes: 4-H members only receive fair passes if they exhibit a project at the fair. In addition, only members 13-19 years old will receive fair passes, since all youth ages 12 and under are admitted free.

One-day car and driver passes will be available upon request (at the rate of one/family/event) for 4-H members who are not eligible to receive 4-H livestock exhibitor passes but who will be participating in one or more of the following non-animal activities at fair:

- 4-H Animal Project Demonstrations scheduled for Wednesday, September 20, 2023, at 3:00 pm at the 4-H Photo Wall.
- 4-H Still Project Demonstrations/Illustrated Talks/Performances and Style Revue scheduled for Wednesday, September 20, 2023, 3:00 - 7:00 pm, in the Community Tent.

4-H Leader Passes: Active registered 4-H leaders will receive a fair pass UPON REQUEST. Individuals registered to serve as leaders, but who have been identified as inactive by club organizational leaders in terms of fulfilling their responsibilities as leaders will NOT receive fair passes. It is the responsibility of 4-H club organizational leaders to see that all project leaders are registered in the St. Joseph County MSU Extension office. (All leader passes MUST be picked up by 5:00 pm on Sunday, September 17.)

EXPRESS PASS

4-H members who will be exhibiting in the 4-H Dog Show, Rabbit Evaluations, or Poultry Evaluations on Saturday, September 16, and who also need to have still projects evaluated on that date may, if their situation meets the conditions stated in the next paragraph, pick up a special 4-H wristband in the 4-H Fair office (located between buildings #43 & #44) that will serve as an "express pass" for still project evaluation. The "express pass" will allow members to be moved to the front of still project evaluation lines.

Express Pass Criteria: Express passes will be distributed only when special access to still project exhibit evaluation is absolutely necessary to ensure that the 4-H member in question can complete participation in both the 4-H Dog Show/Rabbit Evaluations/Poultry Evaluations and Still Exhibit Project Evaluation during the times allotted for these activities.

TSC PAPER CLOVER FALL CAMPAIGN



The fall 2023 4-H Paper Clover Campaign will take place Wednesday, October 4, through Sunday, October 15. Shoppers at the Sturgis and Three Rivers TSC stores will have the opportunity to support 4-H in St. Joseph County by purchasing paper clovers for just \$1 at checkout. All funds raised will be donated to 4-H and will support 4-H youth development program activities in St. Joseph County.

Promotional and club displays are to be set up on Saturday, September 16, 5:00 - 7:30 pm in building #43 or #44.



EARLY CHECK-IN FOR DAIRY, HORSE, SHEEP, AND SWINE MEMBERS

Any Dairy Cattle, Horse, Sheep, and/or Swine member that would like to bring in their animal(s) early may do so on Friday, September 15, 2023, during the following times: Dairy Cattle (not dairy market or dairy feeder) 5:00-8:00 pm., Horse by request, Sheep 4:00-7:00 pm, Swine 4:30-7:00 pm. Superintendents will be on hand to check tag numbers. Animals should be clean and tags easy to read. If tags are not clean and easily read; member, animal, and vehicle will be moved to the end of the unloading line. All Swine will be weighed as unloaded from trailer. Note: There is no reweighing.

MARKET LIVESTOCK WEIGH-IN

Official "weight" of a given market livestock project animal (for show and sale purposes) will be determined when the animal is weighed in at the fair (see weigh-in schedule list). The weight of your animal at this time will determine the specific market "weight-class" your animal will be entered in for competition at fair.

Attention! Market livestock will be weighed ONE TIME ONLY. Market beef cattle, dairy beef, swine, and rabbits must be weighed before being housed.

Poultry = Friday, 4:00 - 7:00 pm
 Rabbits = Friday, 4:00 - 7:00 pm

Lambs = Friday, 4:00 - 7:00 pm and Saturday, 8:00 am - 12:00 pm
 Swine = Friday, 4:30 - 7:00 pm and Saturday, 8:00 am - 12:00 pm

Goats = Saturday, 8:00 am - 12:00 pm
 Steers = Saturday, 8:00 am - 12:00 pm

2023 HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR LIVESTOCK

The following is a summary of important animal heath information for animals brought to exhibit at the 2023 St. Joseph County Grange Fair.

All Cattle (Market & Breeding Stock) - Must have an official radio frequency identification device (RFID) ear tag.

Goats - Have official identification (Scrapies tags) in the ear or tail of animal.

Horses and Ponies - All equine, except foals under six months and nursing their dam, entered in a fair, exhibition, exposition, or show must test negative to an official Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test within the current calendar year. (Coggins Test) Have original on hand with you, a copy should accompany your fair registration form.

Rabbit - No paperwork or vaccinations required at this time.

Sheep - All sheep moved within Michigan shall be identified with official USDA Scrapies program identification tags prior to movement off the farm. Contact the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) at (517) 324-5290 for ear tags.

Swine - Have clean animals and be sure ear tags are readable and clean when entering fair. A NEUES ID tag is also required of all Swine. If your swine does not have a NEUES ID tag or 840 tag in the ear, one will be put in prior to penning the animal at the fair for 2023.

2023 DAIRY FEEDER STEER VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

- Step 1 First vaccination must be received at the June weigh-in to help protect against infectious diseases.
- Step 2 "Booster" the calf two to four weeks later (following the Step 1 vaccination) with the same type of modified live vaccine used in Step 1.
- Step 3 Nasalgen will need to be administered to all steers. 4-H Club leaders will be responsible to administer Nasalgen between August 17 31, 2023.

WATERING LIVESTOCK REMINDER

Due to the potential for transmission of communicable livestock diseases through use of shared drinking water containers, no group watering tanks will be allowed at the fair.

In addition, all animals are to be watered either in their pen/stall or at the appropriate wash rack, and the wash rack cleaned up if necessary (i.e. any manure left behind by your animal properly disposed of). This rule is necessary due to the problems with "water holes" and mud that are created when livestock are watered next to water faucets at the ends of barns.

MIRACLE OF BIRTH TENT

The Birthing tent coordinator is looking for volunteers to help staff the tent during the fair. Your responsibilities would include but are not limited to:

- Encourage and show visitors where to wash their hands after petting animals.
- · Keep area clean of all feces.
- Do not let anyone pet animals that appear ill.

It is requested that you volunteer for a 3-hour shift any time between 8 a.m. and 9 p.m. during the week of the fair (Sunday, September 17 - Saturday, September 23). For more information and/or to sign up for a volunteer time call Steve Wolf at 269-254-5488.

STILL EXHIBIT JUDGING & CLUB BANNER CHECK-IN

All 4-H still exhibits and club banners MUST be checked in and evaluated on Saturday, September 16, 2023, 9:00 am - 12:00 pm or 1:00 - 4:00 pm.

There will be a 1-hour lunch break for judges and judging clerks from 12:00 - 1:00 pm. Still project exhibit buildings will be closed during the lunch break. Member access to the exhibit buildings will be limited as necessary starting at 11:30 am to help ensure that judges wrap things up in time for lunch.

The Still Exhibit Evaluation procedure is as follows:

- 1. Pick up an envelope containing your 4-H member gate admission pass and still project exhibit tags in during the noted times above. Location next to barn #46.
- 2. Report to the EAST end of the appropriate still project exhibit building. An Evaluation Traffic Controller will assist members with finding the right stations.
- 3. 4-H members only will be admitted into the buildings during evaluation times. Each member exhibiting "still projects" will receive a one-on-one evaluation.

Note: Sewing, Knitting, Crocheting & Wardrobe Personalization members will not be asked to change into their garments for evaluation at fair. Sewing and Wardrobe Personalization project members are reminded to bring garments on a hanger(s) so that they are ready to be "hung" on the exhibit building wall for display purposes.



STILL EXHIBIT UNLOADING

Unloading of still exhibits may be done next to the barns; however, your vehicle MUST be moved immediately after unloading is complete (do not leave your vehicle unattended). If your vehicle is left in the unloading zone it will be towed to the back of the southeast parking lot. Please make sure you are not in an animal unloading line.

STYLE REVUE

The 4-H Style Revue will be held on Wednesday, September 20, 2023, at 4:50 pm, Location next to barn #46. All 4-H members who will be exhibiting a completed Sewing, Knitting, Crocheting, and/or Wardrobe Personalization project at fair are eligible to participate in the Style Revue.

Members may model a combination of project exhibits if desired. In addition, members may also use purchased accessories to complete or accentuate their outfit and/or a "prop" to help "set off" the particular type of garment(s) being modeled.

4-H Style Revue participants will be divided into two divisions according to age (8-13 year olds and 14-19 year olds). Members will be judged on their modeling ability and garment fit, and will receive an A, B or C rating and premium accordingly.

DEMONSTARTIONS & PERFORMANCES

All 4-H still project demonstrations, performances, public speaking presentations and illustrated talks will be given on Wednesday, September 20, 2023, 3:00 - 7:00 pm in the Community Tent.

All 4-H animal project demonstrations will take place on Wednesday, September 20, 2023, 3:00 - 4:00 pm at the 4-H Photo wall.

Note: One table and one easel will be provided at each of the above noted locations.

Demonstration/Performance "Times": Sign-up for "times" will be conducted on a first-come, first-served basis next to building #46 on Saturday, September 16, 8:30 am - 12:00 pm and 1:00 - 4:00 pm or in the 4-H Office between buildings #43 & #44 on Sunday, September 18, 2023, 8:00 am - 5:00 pm.

Plan to be at your designated "presentation" location at least 15 minutes early. Be sure to bring all the equipment you need.



The two 4-H still project exhibit buildings (#43 & #44) will be open for public viewing according to the following schedule starting with the opening on Sunday, September 17, 2023.

4-H Still Exhibit Building Monitors will be on duty each day during viewing hours as a security measure to help prevent mishandling and theft of exhibits. This viewing schedule will be strictly adhered to out of concern for security of the exhibits.

PHOTO COVERAGE

4-H members receiving trophies or special awards in still and/or livestock projects may report to the 4-H Fair Photo Wall located on the **NORTH SIDE** of the show arena from 5:00 - 6:00 pm starting on Monday, September 18 and running through Friday, September 22 for "photo opportunities" with reporters from area newspapers.

4-H Photo Information Sheet: All award-winning 4-H members seeking a "photo opportunity" must report to the 4-H Fair Office to obtain and complete a 4-H Photo Information Sheet prior to reporting to the Fair Photo Wall.

"Photo trophies" have been set aside for use in photo sessions with local media. These trophies have blank engraving plates and "generic" figures on top. The trophies will be on loan from our trophy supplier. A volunteer "photo session coordinator" will be on hand each day that photo sessions are scheduled to assist the reporters/photographers. The photo session coordinator will be responsible for: Transporting the "photo trophies" to the photo session location at the 4-H Fair Photo Wall by 4:45 pm, and returning the trophies to the 4-H Fair office at the end of the photo session. Assisting photographers from local newspapers in coordinating an orderly flow of interested members through the photo process. Your cooperation with this system of handling photo opportunities with our local newspapers and fair photographer will be greatly appreciated.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES STILL AVAILABLE

Many volunteers are needed to help with the operation of the 4-H portion of the fair September 16-23. Volunteers are needed to serve as judging clerks, on Saturday, September 16 from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm and/or 1:00 - 4:00 pm. Judging clerks record projects, handling them from evaluation on, by attaching ribbon and recording best of shows/trophies; exhibit set-up, Sunday helpers, and in a variety of other capacities throughout the week.

GOLF/ATV/OFF ROAD VEHICLES POLICY

Golf Carts/ATV/Off Road Vehicles will NOT be allowed for recreational use. Any vehicle, if on the fairgrounds, shall require a permit at a cost of \$50.00 purchased at the fair office.

- The Fair office must have a proof of liability insurance for all vehicles before a permit can be issued. (form available on the Fair website. www.centrevillefair.com)
- Drivers must be 16 years or older with a valid drivers' license. Must have copy filed with fair office.
- Permit must be displayed on vehicle and be visible.
- NO more than the allotted number of people can ride on the vehicle than the available seating
- A map will be given to each person showing the routes allowed to travel based on type of permit given and time of day.
- Any violation to these rules may result in the removal of the vehicle from the fairgrounds.
- Lights must be on the front and rear with proper intensity and must be operating after dark.

Exception: persons handicapped and/or disabled will be allowed to have battery-powered wheelchairs and/or battery-powered three-wheeled scooters.





AG-CITING EXPERIENCE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

- Entry Tags: 4-H members will not be allowed to add classes that they do not have tags for on Saturday, September 18.
 Only projects registered on the entry forms will have printed tags. These will be the only projects that we have in our computer system.
- Rabbit exhibitors: Showmanship classes dress code long sleeve white shirt, black pants, closed toes shoes. Market and Breeding Stock classes long sleeve shirt, dark colored pants, closed toe shoes.

THANK YOU NOTE CARDS FOR SALE



The 4-H Youth Council will be offering "sets" of 4-H "thank you" note cards, for sale at fair, with each "set" including a 4-H "note card", plus a stamped envelope. "Thank you" note sets may be purchased at the 4-H Fair office starting on Sunday, September 17, 2023, and running through Saturday, September 23 during regularly scheduled office hours for as long as supplies last.

At \$2.00 each, these attractive "thank you" note sets are a great buy for use in writing "thank you" notes to trophy, plaque and special award donors and market livestock buyers! (However, the use of "4-H" thank you note stationary is not required.)

Trophy and special award recipients are required to write and submit a "thank you" note for the donor(s) of each trophy/special award received. The "thank you" note is then exchanged by the member for his/her trophy/special award. "Thank you" notes must be submitted in a stamped envelope (which has both the donor's address and the award recipient's return address neatly written on the envelope). Note: If the "thank you" note is for a buyer, write on the back of the envelope what species of yours they purchased.

Attention: Thank you notes (including envelopes) should be written using an ink pen to end up with the most professional and neat-looking results! In addition, the 4-H Youth Program Coordinator reserves the right to refuse "thank you" notes submitted with sloppily and/or incompletely addressed envelopes and/or dirt-smudged envelopes.

Donor Name/Address Information: The trophy/special award donor's name will be printed on a "donor identification card" that will be attached to each trophy/special award. A list of all trophies/plaques/special awards and the corresponding donors (including the donor's complete address and the name of the "contact person" for business donors) will be posted on the A-frame in the middle of building #43.

Buyer Name/Address Information: The buyer's name and number will be written on a sheet of paper that is filled out immediately following the sale of your animal. A list of all buyers (including complete address and "contact person" for businesses) will be posted on the A-frame in the middle of building #43.

Be sure to put some real time and thought into composing your note. Hastily written notes are not well received by donors and buyers. It is up to you as an award winner to express your appreciation in such a way that donors are encouraged to continue donating trophies and special awards in the future. Without the support of our donors, the awarding of fair trophies and awards would not be possible.

TROPHIES & SPEICAL AWARDS PICK-UP

Trophies and special awards may be picked up on Saturday, September 23, 2023, 10:00 - 11:00 p.m. and Sunday, September 24, 2023, 9:00 am- 12:00 pm in building #43.

To pick-up your trophy you must submit a stamped and sealed, thank you note written to the donor with the correct address and your return address. Thank you notes with pre-stamped envelopes will be for sale in the 4-H office for \$2.00 each during regularly scheduled hours. A listing of all the donors, with correct spelling address etc. will be posted in building #43.





SHOOTING SPORTS

Thanks to the wonderful efforts of a few volunteers this year, St. Joseph County 4-H members who are interested in archery, BB gun, shotgun and rifle will be able to compete in the 18th annual county "shoot". This is possible because of the many hours the shooting sports volunteers put in to organize and work with the kids throughout the year. The "shoot" will take place at the St. Joseph County Conservation Club. Check with your discipline leader for specific date and time. The conservation club and leaders have been very influential in helping get support from other organizations for supplies, etc. and have offered hunter safety classes, that are necessary to participate in any shoot. For more information, contact your shooting sports leader. Each shooting sports participant must also do an educational still project to be judged on Saturday, September 16, 2023.

RELEASE OF EXHIBITS AT THE END OF THE WEEK

- Saturday, September 23 All 4-H still project exhibits released from 10:00 11:00 pm.
- **Sunday, September 24** All livestock will be released between 5:30 and 10:00 am. This includes beef cattle, dairy beef, dairy cattle, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, swine, and horses.
- Sunday, September 24 Pick up of any remaining still project exhibits from 9:00 11:00 am in buildings #43 and #44.

It is highly recommended that still exhibits be picked up during the above noted times as there is no guarantee of exhibit security. Any exhibits not picked up two weeks following the fair will either be disposed of or given to a charitable organization as deemed appropriate.

PEN/STALL CLEAN OUT POST-FAIR



The Fair Board requests that all livestock exhibitors clean out their pens/stalls on Sunday, September 24 following removal of animals. This clean-out effort on your part really helps the fair maintenance staff get the fairgrounds back in order quickly and efficiently following the fair. 4-H project leaders will be responsible for organizing their members to get the clean-up accomplished. Be sure to visit with the appropriate 4-H animal superintendent/assistant superintendent during fair week to get details on how the clean-out will be handled. Attention: All 4-H Livestock member/clubs will be held responsible for cleaning and tearing down their project pen/stall at the end of fair. Individuals or clubs maybe assessed a \$50.00 fine for failure to do so.

4-H MEMORIAL PARK

Access to the 4-H office during the fair is by way of the beautiful brick-paved pathway. There have been several bricks added to the walkway this year. To put your mark on the fairgrounds, pick up a 4-H Donate-A-Brick Program form. Fill it out and return it to the MSU Extension office. **Note:** The Donate-A-Brick Program is a fund-raiser for the 4-H Youth Council that started with the 2001 fair season.

STILL PROJECT AUCTION

The purpose of the still project auction:

- To entice more interest in 4-H youth participation in still project areas because of the opportunity of financial gain.
- To give the 4-H still project exhibitors the "marketing" experience like the livestock exhibitors have, such as face-to-face experience with potential buyers, writing skills in the form of buyer letters and Thank-you notes, and the character-building skills of presentation in the sale ring.
- To have the means for funds specifically earmarked for Still Project area development and Exhibit improvements by assessing a small commission.

Criteria for Still Project Auction Entry:

- 1. Entry is completely voluntary.
- 2. Exhibitor must have shown in that project area at least once before.
- 3. Project must be entered in current year fair and receive an "A" rating.
- 4. 4-H member MUST take project through the auction.
- 5. Auction entry form must be completed and turned into the 4-H office by Monday, September 20 at noon to allow committee enough time to verify placings and completeness of application.
- 6. If project was awarded a trophy/award, the appropriate thank you note must be submitted with the Auction Entry form. Committee will record this on 4-H office records.
- 7. Project may be pulled from auction with a written request by exhibitor and parent/guardian no later than Friday, September 22 at 5:00 p.m.
- 8. Items entered in Auction will be moved to barn #44 on Monday afternoon.
- 9. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to contact at least three potential buyers in writing and/or in person to attend the auction.
- 10. Auction will be held in Still Exhibit Barn #44 at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 23, 2023. Thank you cards for auction items must be turned in to the 4-H office by October 1, 2023. No monies will be released to the exhibitor until thank you note is turned in.
- 11. Items that are auctioned become the property of the buyer upon completion of the sale. Project item must remain on display until the designated pick-up time. **Exception:** A fresh batch of food product must be made to give to buyer(s) on Saturday.
- 12. Items purchased may be picked up on Saturday, September 23 after 10:00 p.m. or Sunday, September 24, between 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. (same as other still projects) with Bill of Sale ONLY.
- 13. There will be a Sales Commission of 2% deducted from sale check. These monies will remain with the SJC Youth Council and be used for Still Project Development programs/workshops and Still Project Exhibit/Display improvements only.





GOING HOME: BIOSECURITY TIPS FOR ANIMALS THAT WENT TO THE COUNTY FAIR

Animals exhibited at the county fair that will return to their home herds pose a significant biosecurity risk to the animals left at home. Follow these steps after the fair has ended to protect everyone.

Animals that have been exhibited during the county fair are likely near and dear to their exhibitors' hearts. After all, they spent countless hours training and preparing their animal for the show at the fair. We protect them from everything before the show season, but do we give enough thought about what happens when they go home? Each time an animal is taken out of its home environment and exhibited, there is a certain amount of risk for exposure to illness.

Michigan State University Extension offers these biosecurity steps exhibitors can take to protect their show animals and those that were left at home after the fair has ended.

- Keep animals that were at the fair separate from animals that were not for 28 30 days. If at all possible, do not allow nose-to-nose contact and provide as much distance between animals.
- Disinfect all buckets, feeders, tools and footwear that was at the fair.
- Throw away any feed or hay that was at the fair.
- Always wear clean clothes and footwear. Boot coverings may be helpful when caring for animals.
- Take care of animals that stayed home from the show first, and animals that were at the show second. Do not go back and forth between animals as this increases the risk of cross-contamination.
- Do not eat or drink in the barn.
- Observe animals daily for signs and symptoms of illness, such as:
 - Obvious pain or discomfort.
 - Decrease in appetite and water intake.
 - · Fever.
 - Lethargy.
 - Diarrhea or changes in consistency in manure.
 - Discharge from nasal cavity or eyes.
 - · Overall weakness.

If you notice any of the above symptoms, please call your veterinarian immediately.

Care of animals after the fair is critical. Exhibited animals were exposed to animals from other farms, fair goers who may not have washed their hands in between various species of animals, and potentially a lot of stress. By following these steps, you can help keep all of your animals safe and healthy.
