Area Garden Leaders Needed: The gray days of January getting you down? Longing for the rejuvenation of the spring season of growth? Spring will be here before you know it! Happy New Year – 2023 is here! This promises to be another bountiful year, and I would like to send a heartfelt thank you to all past and present volunteers who have provided the labor of love and care to this special garden, and to encourage any new volunteers to check us out.



Although winter is here and it can be quite gloomy, the team has embarked on a project to create a PAR Garden Handbook with details on each of the crops that we plant and

harvest each year. This will be an invaluable resource going forward to provide detailed information for any volunteer who is interested in supporting the garden and has questions regarding planting, maintenance, and harvesting, including pest management and cleaning and storage considerations.



Our planting schedule and plans were completed last year and added to the CSA seed order. We may have some additional tasks to help in the greenhouse, as the CSA team helps us

every year by planting and growing transplants – this year for cabbage, alliums, and cucumbers. I will reach out if we are summoned to assist. Our plans include continuing to use companion plants to help with weed and pest control, as well as add variety with borage, parsley, and marigolds. Not only is it fun, but it has proven to be quite beneficial and beautiful.

As we will be adding cucumbers and hot peppers to our crops, we will also be adding stakes and trellises to support these plants. We are still working on the design

and trying to be creative with materials that are sustainable, recyclable, and beautiful of course. If you have any great ideas for this project, we would love to hear about them.



As previously mentioned, we winterized the garden with the oat / pea cover crop, black plastic, and straw over the garlic beds, and will be assessing the success of each in

helping with weed suppression, pest control, and soil amendment. In addition, the irrigation system will need to be fully checked and maintained as we kick off the season.

We will continue to donate to local food pantries as well as Forgotten Harvest and are proud of our contribution to helping with food security. As always, it is important to note that this success must be attributed to the dedicated volunteers and the MSU Tollgate Farm staff, including the very helpful CSA team.



We will continue to divide and conquer with multiple workdays each week - most likely Monday and Thursday mornings, which seem to work best for most volunteers and the organizations that pick up our donations. More information will be forthcoming as we approach our gardening season. Please feel free to

reach out if you have any questions or concerns.

Looking forward to another great season in 2023, as well as to welcoming new volunteers who are interested in joining our fantastic team and providing such a valuable service to the community.

Tollgate Garden Volunteer Membership Levels

When you renew your TGV membership each year, we ask you to designate your status as an ACTIVE member or a SUPPORTING member. As a reminder, these designations mean the following:

<u>ACTIVE MEMBER</u>: Volunteer in the gardens on workdays or individual assignments, volunteer at events and projects on the site, receive all communication and participate in monthly meetings.

- All active volunteers must go through the MSU Volunteer Selection Process (VSP) screening to work on site and maintain their VSP status yearly.
- Extension Master Gardeners (EMG) are screened through the VSP process either at the start of the program when you take the EMG class or when you renew your EMG certification/VSP update each year. If you are an active/current EMG and choose to volunteer at Tollgate, your VSP status is complete.
- Previously certified EMGs who decide to let their certification lapse can still volunteer on the site, but must go through the VSP screening on an annual basis. We have onsite personnel who can help you complete the process.
- If you are an active MSU volunteer through another program or site and have maintained an active VSP status, then your VSP status is complete
- Individuals who have not gone through the VSP screening, will need to pursue the VSP screening before they can be an active volunteer at Tollgate (or at any MSU site or program). We have onsite personnel who can help you complete this process.
- Note that once an individual has participated in the initial VSP screening, they need only approve a background check in subsequent years. No need to obtain references and other activities that are required with the initial VSP screening.

SUPPORTING MEMBER: Support the volunteers and participate in monthly meetings.

- Notified regarding monthly membership meetings.
- Informed about Tollgate events via the Farm News newsletter and other informative e-mail notifications.
- Supporter status will **not** allow you to participate as a volunteer in the garden maintenance activities, maple syrup project or any events on site.
- Return to an "ACTIVE" status at any time by completing the VSP screening process.

A donation is NOT required to renew your membership. All donations are greatly appreciated and go into our account to maintain the gardens.
