FROM THE TOLLGATE FARM MANAGER

GREETINGS Roy Prentice



Greetings all,

August has come and gone. Summer is flying by. Colder temperatures may soon arrive – but are not here just yet. The end of August has seen the completion of a successful summer camp season.



Several hundred campers had lots of adventures on the farm. In addition to the usual camps which featured hiking in the woods and fishing in the pond, Tollgate hosted a week of Adventure camp filled with kayaking, rock climbing, and other high energy outdoor sports and three weeks of horse camp filled with, well, horses. Having the kids back on the farm in full-strength camps made things feel quite a bit more normal.



Since winter is inevitable, we have been spending a lot of time recently gathering the second cutting of hay. If you are a goat, the second cutting is much yummier than the first cutting harvested back in June. Lots more grass blades in the second cutting and fewer of those pesky stalks. With this year's dry, hot weather, the crop promises to be on the meager side. We use lots of hay to keep the Tollgate animals well fed. It takes lots of work to keep them happy through the winter. It's all worthwhile though whenever one of the goats gives you a nod of approval and a wink of appreciation as they dive into the hay feeder for a winter bite.

Recognition Dinner: We are planning to host the Volunteer Recognition dinner this November. If you have attended past years' events, you know that the recognition dinner is a great event that brings us all together in a celebration of the gardening year. **To get an invitation to the dinner, you need to sign in at least once at a Tollgate workday using the QR code system.** The Recognition dinner is scheduled for Saturday, November 5, beginning at 4:00pm. ATTENTION AGL AND GARDEN TEAM

MEMBERS- All AGLs who had submitted a budget request for your garden this season need to submit your expense reimbursement forms as soon as possible. MSU has imposed a 90-day limit on expenses that can be reimbursed. That means you have 90 days from purchase to have Roy submit your reimbursement request. Any delay would risk reimbursement rejection. Contact me or Roy for info or forms. As you work in your gardens these remaining weeks of the season, please assess for plant identification tags needed for your area and submit to Roy ASAP. We hope to work on the required tags during the slower winter months. Accurate Latin name, and common name are best, and a variety name if it is known. It is our goal to have all gardens with this information to enhance the educational value and enjoyment for all visitors.

NOMINATIONS

A call for all interested members! September brings the time to make nominations for the officer positions on your Tollgate Gardens Advisory Council (TGAC). All elected positions are voted on every year. This includes President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary. Serving as a TGAC board member contributes to our organization in ways that do not require physical labor and thus opens another opportunity to participate. These hours are considered towards (re-) certification and this opportunity is open to **any** member. You may nominate yourself or any other willing Tollgate volunteer. Most positions do not require specific experience but general organizational skills and a love of working with people is a plus! The Nursery opened August 20 for your Fall plant donations! This marks the first step to restock the Nursery for the Fall Plant Sale, and get a head start on plants that will overwinter in the Nursery and be ready for the Spring sale in June 2023.

The FALL PLANT SALE is SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 17 during the typical workday hours of 9 am – Noon. This is a smaller, more casual event than Spring, that features late summer and fall blooming plants that aren't very attractive in early June - but all the plants in the Nursery will be available for sale. Tollgate Plant Sales are a great way to find affordable plants to expand or add variety to your garden. Many of our plants are divisions from the beautiful gardens at Tollgate, as well as from your fellow Tollgate gardeners. We will have a large supply of natives, many grown from seed at Tollgate North (Deb Kearney's basement greenhouse) - including lots of



milkweeds to support Monarch butterflies. Note that there is another event at the farm beginning at 10 am. Helpers will be available to transport purchases to your vehicle, even if you are parked in the main parking lot.

WHY DO WE HAVE TO STOP ACCEPTING DONATIONS? The short answer is that we have a lot of work that we must get done before the weather gets too cold... and we're never sure how long we will have! Once the weather turns really cold or rainy, most of our work becomes somewhere between really miserable and just impossible to do!

OVERWINTERING PREP begins after the Fall sale when all the pots are in their assigned location, and we have taken a physical inventory of everything. Then we can push down the Plant ID sticks deep into the pot to prevent them popping out and being lost over the winter and the foliage on most plants is cut back hard to prevent disease. The final step is to move pots close together in larger groups within their assigned rows and surround them with wood chips that provide some insulation from the temperature fluctuations of a Michigan winter. We work to keep mulch off the top of the pots because this holds too much moisture in in the soil.

SOME PLANTS NEED EXTRA HELP TO **OVERWINTER SUCCESSFULLY...** Although all our plants are hardy in Michigan, some are more vulnerable to Michigan's freeze/thaw cycle that traps moisture in the pot and can damage roots. In the past we have selected these pots for special treatment under ROW COVERS. While this provides good protection from excess moisture and temperature changes while the covers are on (from late November until usually sometime in March), a wet fall and/or spring rains will still result in wet and soggy roots. We will be experimenting with a different strategy to overwinter these plants this year, but it will still require moving selected plants to special winter locations before closing the Nursery for the winter. The CHALLENGE is to complete all of this before the REALLY COLD weather arrives!

If this sounds interesting to you, consider joining the Nursery Team for next season! It can be fun to learn about lots of different plants, including how to grow them in a pot! You can join as a ROW LEADER (focus your attention on maintaining a group of plants in one specific area), or a **MEMBER-AT-LARGE** (a generalist who is kept in the loop with all that's happening in the Nursery and helps out with whatever projects are ongoing as you are available). In either role, you can be part of future changes as we work to continually improve our operations, learn about growing lots of different plants and raise money to support all the Tollgate Gardens! Harvest total is just under 2500 lbs.! This is the highest yield at this point in the season since 2015. It is a record,

with 640 lbs. of beets, 508 lbs. of potatoes, 276 lbs. of cabbage, and 512 lbs. of onions!



The summer squash and beans are going strong, as well, with many more to come -We have harvested 180 lbs. of carrots and have just scratched the surface - they are abundant despite

sharing them with mice and voles.

Our garlic was cured in the shed and weighed in at 13 lbs. – we may need to use most of it as seed garlic for next year, as we had an irrigation issue that caused the garlic to be smaller than expected. We still have purple cabbage, winter squash, and leeks to harvest, as well as the succession crops of summer squash, turnips, and radishes. So, plenty more to come.

This month we started supplying fresh produce to PB&J – an organization that services the homeless in downtown Detroit with an average of 200 people served per week. Check them out on <u>www.pbjoutreach.org</u>. This is a great addition, as they pick up on Fridays for a Saturday distribution, and that means that our Thursday harvest is used at its freshest. Forgotten Harvest is picking up on Mondays after our Monday harvest, so all our produce is served at its best.

MSU is working on a potato cultivar that is resistant to the potato beetle, so maybe soon we will have a better choice for fighting this pest. In the meantime, we will continue to rotate beds as far away as possible from the previous season, plant fewer beds with red potatoes only, plant later to avoid the first emergence of the potato beetle, till the beds, and plant marigolds around the bed perimeters. Hopefully this will alleviate the problem – fingers crossed! There is also a newer Bt pesticide that looks promising in the management of the potato beetle, so we may give this a go as well. We will keep you posted on progress.

It is time to plant our cover crops – oat and pea. We will be trying this out in several beds to help enrich the soil, but also as a weed deterrent. This cover crop will die out over the winter and can be worked into the soil or simply raked off come spring. Thanks to the CSA team again for their help in selecting a good cover crop and educating us on timing and planting instructions. We might even be able to use it as a mulch if we leave it in the beds.

The cilantro has flowered and now has an abundance of coriander seeds to be picked. The little seeds just need to be dried and, voila, you have a wonderful spice. It is a great herb as it helps with weed management, provides cilantro for many tasty uses, and then supplies coriander. The borage turned out to be a great success planted with the squash - it attracted many pollinators, helped with weed control, and the leaves and flowers can be eaten in salads or sauteed. The shallots, as mentioned before, were a great companion to the beets. The parsley in the cabbage beds got a little lost, but we still had a good amount to harvest. We will certainly be continuing to companion plant to get the best weed control, bed coverage, pest management, and variety, as well as beauty in the garden.

Several of our vegetables require curing and processing – carrots, onions, and garlic. The



carrots need to have the dirt washed off and if not picked up quickly, the greens removed. By the way, the



Onions need to be laid out to let the tops/ greens dry out, and then the tops and roots need to be cut off. The garlic must be bundled and hung up in a dry warm place (our shed is perfect) to dry, and then the tops and roots need to be cut off. Another work task for the diligent volunteers, who seem to always be ready for anything.

As the season starts to wind down, it is time to begin to reflect on next year and the successes and challenges to prepare for, as well as how to continue to add variety, diversity, and fun to our beautiful PAR Garden.

Meadowbrook Road Work

Construction of a new water main continues on Meadowbrook Road. This will be a long process that is likely to continue through the summer of 2023. At this point, MSU Tollgate is accessible only from the south, from 12 Mile Road. Despite the scary intersection at 12 Mile and Meadowbrook, the road is open to Tollgate. What's happening? A new water main is being installed that will service Novi and surrounding communities. In time, this water main will be buried under the north bound lane of Meadowbrook Road. The large hot tub looking feature near 12 Mile is actually a 30' deep pit. It is part of the process of boring under 12 Mile Road for the truly massive water main. I am sure that the water will be much tastier when the project is finished. - Roy
