Spring Wildlife in Michigan

Environmental educator and naturalist **Andrew Nowicki** will talk about spring wildlife in Michigan to increase our awareness of animal habitats. His interpretive program will cover local animals with tips for observing birds, insects, reptiles, and mammals. For example, spring is the best time to be on the lookout for Chorus frogs who will be difficult to find in the summer.

Andrew runs programs across the state teaching audiences about wildlife and improving outdoor experiences. He also does guided nature walks and owl hikes. His website is https://nowicki418.wixsite.com/wildlife and includes downloadable pamphlets to learn more about the connections between people and the environment. Andrew works at the Howell Nature Center (though this is not an HNC program). He has worked as a wildlife technician conducting biological surveys. Andrew earned a BS in zoology from Michigan State University.

Greetings all,

Maple Syrup Making



Time to say goodbye to the 2021 maple season. The word for the season was "early." The season

started early and ended after the third week in March. After a bit of pre-season maintenance to the reverse osmosis machine, it performed to everyone's satisfaction saving lots of time and firewood. The RO machine extracts water from the sap solution concentrating the sugar in the sap thereby greatly reducing the time needed to boil off water, concentrate sugar and make syrup. Tollgate's RO master, Kurt Westermann, trained several new RO operators this year. Their addition to the syrup making efforts is greatly appreciated.

Although there were no field trips or group visits to the maple operation in 2021, lots of virtual programming took place in the woods. The MSU Tollgate educational staff took full advantage of the maple season to share Tollgate's story with classrooms throughout SE Michigan. Many volunteers helped with the sap gathering, firewood hauling, and evaporator tending, all while keeping Covid guidelines in mind. The season was short, but fruitful producing 95 gallons of syrup. Thanks to all who made our 2021 season a success even under difficult circumstances.

Tollgate's Nursery will open for the season on Saturday, April 17 – welcoming donations from all our faithful Tollgate Garden Volunteers! The pop-up will be set up and ready to receive donations from your home garden. *Following are just a few highlights of our "most needed" varieties:*

FERNS are great accent plants for shade gardens... we have plenty of Ostrich ferns *(Mateuccia struthiopteris)*, but are looking for some other popular varieties in the Athyrium genus: *Athyrium-felix-femina* -Lady Fern, *Athyrium niponicum* - Japanese Painted Fern, Athyrium 'Ghost' – Ghost Fern; as well as *Osumdastrum cinnamomeum* (Cinnamon Fern).

ECHINACEA (Coneflower) varieties are a popular staple of sunny Michigan gardens, whether the familiar native *E. purpurea* (Purple Coneflower) or one of the multitude of cultivars with different bloom colors, double blooms, compact size or other interesting features. PAR GARDEN

The planting season is finally here! The soil is warming and softening, birds are foraging and singing, the view is turning from brown to green, and soon we will have the wonderful Spring burst of colors. And, it is time to start growing wonderful fresh vegetables. We will be busy this month prepping all the beds – removing the covers, early weeding, gently turning the beds, and checking/ maintaining the irrigation. This is also a great time to check, clean, and sharpen all our tools.





But best of all, we will begin planting the onion and cabbage transplants from the greenhouse (don't they look great!), as well as direct seeding radishes, carrots, and beets. Since we are still on alert for the final frost day, and need warmer soil temperatures, the turnips, squash, and potatoes will wait until May. We are also trying to avoid an early infestation of potato beetles by planting the potatoes a little later.

We still need volunteers for Wednesdays and alternate Thursdays, and this is a great way to work the soil, enjoy fresh air, have fun, socialize, get in EMG volunteer hours, and best of all contribute a valuable service for those in need. You do not need to have knowledge or experience growing vegetables, just a passion for gardening.
