Thursday, August 19, 2021 7:00 PM

Cooking with Mary Spencer - Live & in Person at Tollgate

Join garden volunteers and supporters in the **picnic pavilion** (or the barn depending on the weather) on **Thursday evening, August 19**. Tollgate members look forward to Mary Spencer's annual cooking demonstrations, especially the samples and recipes. This year, Mary will demonstrate making a pasta with a 15-minute burst cherry tomato sauce. She will also prepare a Spanish tapas with pan con tomate (Spain's version of bruschetta) using tomato, cucumber, avocado and lime with a feta vinaigrette. Mary will also answer your general questions about cooking or ingredients.

Mary Spencer's goal is to make people better cooks. Before Covid, she taught a variety of cooking classes at The Old World Olive Company in Plymouth and at ABC Warehouse locations in Livonia, Troy, Lakeside and Novi. Her business, *Taste: A Cook's Place*, <u>www.tasteacooksplace.net</u>, is delivering home cooked five-course dinners with generous portions on most Thursdays and Sundays. Mary and Sammy Spencer do contactless deliveries within 20 miles of Plymouth.

Mary has conducted food tours, done menu planning and researched heirloom recipes. She has been teaching cooking for approximately 20 years and has over 5,500 cookbooks in her personal collection.

It has been a busy summer on the farm. Although the pandemic is still with us, signs of re-emergence are everywhere. Tollgate is hosting several camps this summer. In recognition of the Covid concerns still with us, the kids are spending 99% of their time outdoors. Each week brings a chorus of small voices as groups roam the gardens and grounds. With its varied environments of woods, fields, and water, Tollgate is ideal as a camp focus.

The Nursery is usually a quiet place after the Spring Sale, with fewer plants and not much going on until fall donations begin to arrive later in

August. But this year has been different - we have been preparing to close the SHADE house and move those plants into nursery space under the wooden trellis!



Closing the SHADE house is just the latest step in the Nursery evolution that began in the

fall of 2014 with the construction of the first section of the wooden trellis. Completed as part of a Scout project, the initial construction of a 12-foot trellis section in the area south of the Shade House provided a bit of relief from the sun in the center section of the nursery.



of protection from the sun's heat.



In 2017, a second, much larger section of trellis was built, adding three 12foot sections to the south of the original section, including a 4-foot center aisle that

ran east – west. This created a natural separation between the "SUN" plants on the south side and what we dubbed the "ANNEX" north of the center path.



The last 12-foot section on the southern border was installed in spring of 2018. And recently this year, the trellis was extended to the

east, to fully cover SUN Rows 1 and 2 and ANNEX Rows 19 and 20.

The new structure has meant more space for

plants at our sales! But more pots also require more maintenance, and hand watering, dragging long, heavy hoses through the nursery became a challenge. It helped some when multiple hose stations were installed along the center aisle of the trellis nursery and in the shade house, with lighter flexible hoses. We created a schedule of volunteers to water pots throughout the summer. Then we enlisted the help of some of our creative Tollgate experts to design a creative solution that didn't require people driving to the farm multiple times per week!

During the summer of 2019, an overhead sprinkler system was installed for the 9 rows under the trellis on the south side of

the nursery! The creativity and engineering design came courtesy of Kurt Westermann and John Woodrich, who had lots of experience with challenging projects in the PAR garden and the Maple Syrup operation.



Thanks to their creativity and willingness to help, an ingenious system of overhead sprinklers was installed for SUN rows 2 - 10 under the trellis. This irrigation system was recently expanded to include rows 11 -19. And the extension of the

trellis structure over Rows 1 and 20 that was completed this spring will enable a future expansion of the irrigation system to cover the entire nursery!

With watering issues addressed, we began to notice increasing deer damage. Roy Prentice, our amazing creative Farm Manager, came up with a unique solution that was implemented this year with great success! We needed a system that protected the plants that could also be quickly and easily dismantled to allow complete access for Plant Sale crowds. It must also always provide easy access for Nursery workers moving plants in wheelbarrows or our large wagon. Roy's innovative design passed the Plant Sale Test with flying colors this year – we were able to remove all the deer fencing in a relatively short period of time and reinstall it at the end of the day - twice! Also, we have everyday access through 4 swing gates with a double lock closure system – providing everyday worker access from each side of the nursery.

Consolidating our pots under the Trellis

Nursery will help us to operate much more efficiently! The overhead trellis provides a bit of sun protection that is appreciated by most plants growing in a pot - and the humans tending to them! The availability of automated overhead irrigation is a significant advantage vs. the need to hand water the prior Shade House structure. The rows under the Trellis have automated, timer controlled overhead irrigation for Rows 2 through 19. With the completion of the overhead trellis over Rows 1 and 20, the physical structure will be in place to add another zone of overhead misters.

This more efficient Nursery configuration will support many successful plant sales in the future! The "max capacity" of the previous nursery configuration was about 5,000 pots. The new capacity is over 4,000 pots, which is significantly more stock than we've had even in our peak sales years... plenty of space for plants and a better environment for people!

We're getting ready to start restocking the Nursery with fall divisions – so keep the Nursery in mind as you clean up your gardens this fall. The PLANTS WANTED list will be available soon to help you to know what plants we need the most! The Nursery cannot be successful without the donations of plants from our gardener friends as well as the many divisions that we receive from Tollgate's beautiful gardens!

This is a great time to join the Nursery Team!

You can be part of future changes as we work to continually improve our operations. Learn about growing lots of different varieties of plants and raise money to support all the Tollgate Gardens! More shade and easier watering chores have definitely made the environment for volunteers more comfortable – but we still have lots of hard work to do too! Only partway through the season, and we have harvested over 900 lbs. of garlic, radishes, cabbage, turnips, potatoes, onions, beets, carrots, beans, zucchini, and yellow squash thanks to a very dedicated and wonderful team of volunteers.

There are plenty more beets, carrots, onions, potatoes, beans, zucchini, yellow squash, and winter squash to harvest over the next three months.



Check out the pictures of some of the bounty and the beautiful red flowers from a new variety of bean that we planted this year. We are very grateful to have Darby Anderson (CSA)

helping us by delivering our fresh vegetables to CARES and Feed the Need each week, as well as sharing knowledge, tools, and storage bins – thank you.



The garlic has been harvested and hung in the shed to cure. Soon we will clean them up and they will be ready to share. We will also be storing several heads to provide the seeds for planting in the fall. The aroma in the shed is wonderful. It is the first crop planted for the next season, and as Darby shared with me – it is a promise to return in the Spring!

All the rain has had an unfortunate side effect – many of the vegetables are rotting, and the carrots are splitting due to the soggy soil. In addition, we have lost some to pests, including gigantic voles which have been eating their way through our radishes, cabbage, squash, turnips, and even the potatoes. They are quite bold, and don't seem to be bothered too much by us when we are harvesting. However, on a positive note, we have replanted seven beds with more beets and carrots, so there will be more vegetables at the end of the season. We will be adding soil to the beds and mounding them to help with better drainage next year.

In addition to weeding and harvesting this month, as we fully harvest a bed, we will be turning, raking, and covering the spent beds to minimize the weed growth and prepare them for spring planting. Based on pest and disease conditions in the beds, it is already time to start planning the garden layout to rotate vulnerable crops to new beds and assess new strategies for dealing with our challenging pest population and weeds. We are considering flame-throwing the potato beds after they have been planted to kill overwintering adult potato beetles, as well as hoop row covers to minimize access to the potato plants from other infested beds. We will avoid planting cabbage or any other crucifer crops in the raised beds due to black rot disease in those beds. We are still working on how to address the pesky voles. Every year is different and presents us with opportunities to learn and try new approaches to maximizing our harvest for those in need. It keeps the gardening interesting and rewarding. Happy Gardening!
