Science Updates for Gardeners

Join Tollgate volunteers and supporters for an evening of garden science. Dean Krauskopf, Ph.D., retired host of *The Gardening Show* on News/Talk 760 WJR, will put weather conditions into a broader context, share the latest information about some problems that gardeners may face this year, and discuss citizen science. He will also answer your gardening questions.

Dean retired from MSU as the Integrated Crop Management Agent for Southeastern Michigan. He taught many Master Gardener training classes. His doctorate in horticulture is from North Carolina State University.

THANK-YOU for your donations to Tollgate's Nursery! We appreciate the many great donations from Tollgate Volunteers, as well as divisions of plants from the beautiful gardens on the property, but we can still use more! Below are a few suggestions to highlight some of our greater needs (please drop off all donations by Saturday May 22).

Aquilegia (Columbine) – this spring bloomer is usually very popular at the spring sale, particularly if in bloom. Do you have some in your garden that you could share?



Aquilegia vulgaris 'Blue Barlow'

Although *Chrysanthemum* (Garden Mum) is a fall bloomer, it has typically sold well at the spring sale. We don't have any yet but would love to have a few for the sale.



Chrysanthemum 'Robinson Red'

We usually sell all the *Dicentra* (Bleeding Heart) that we have available at our spring sale. Even after the blooms are gone, the delicate foliage is attractive in the garden all summer.

Phlox (Garden Phlox) is a staple plant in a sunny Michigan garden, and we could use much more - all colors. If you know the specific cultivar of your donation, that's even better!



Phlox paniculata 'Bright Eyes'

Echinacea (Coneflower) is another staple, with the native purple coneflower (E. purpurea), and many cultivars that seem to cover the rainbow. If you have these in your garden, maybe there is a crowded corner that you can clean up and donate the excess to Tollgate!

Lavandula (Lavender) is always on our list because it sells so well, but it is very difficult to overwinter in a pot, and divisions of mature plants don't always do well either. Younger plants with some new growth that can be potted up are the best option, if you have some you could donate.

Thanks to the incredibly dedicated and hardworking volunteers, the weed garden has been beautifully transformed back into a vegetable garden – check out the before and after pictures. The dead nettle and grasses really benefitted from the very warm start to Spring, and the white plastic bed covers acted as a greenhouse, further encouraging a bountiful weed crop. The moral of the story for next year is black tarp covering all beds and pathways.

All thirty-five beds are fully weeded, prepped, with irrigation in place and the timers set, and best of all - 25 beds have been planted so far: 7 beds of potatoes, 5 beds of cabbage, 5 beds of onions, 4 beds of carrots, and 4 beds of beets. This month, we will complete the planting with 1 bed of turnips. 1 bed of radishes, 2 beds of summer squash, 2 beds of winter squash, and 2 beds of pole beans (shared with 2 side rows of garlic).

If you are doing the math, it may seem like I missed a couple of beds, but remember we have 2 beds of garlic planted in the fall of last year. Fortunately, most of our vegetables are cool season crops, so the chilly weather has not really impeded our planting progress.

We have been greatly assisted by the wonderful MSU Tollgate Farm staff who have significantly improved our garden roadway by laying stones to cover the ruts and help with managing the weeds and grass, delivering mulch, and especially CSA help with the row seeder that significantly helps to reduce the time needed to plant and thin carrots and beets.

Not only have the volunteers braved chilly, rainy. snowy, and windy weather to whip our garden into shape, but we have a talented photographer who provided the pictures of the garlic and onions which are progressing very nicely. A heartfelt thank you to this wonderful team!

NESTING IN THE PAR GARD

These Kildeer eggs were found by the PAR garden team as they began to weed the garden rows for planting. The team marked the nest and avoided work in that area until the eggs hatched. Kildeer lay their uniquely shaped eggs on the ground. This shape prevents them from rolling out of the nest. The parent bird has a distinctive nest protection display, often using a "broken-wing" act to lure away intruders.
