PumpkinFest

PumpkinFest was a great event again this year. It was wonderful to see so many families enjoying the farm's outdoor spaces. The event was a lot of work for volunteers and staff, but loads of fun too. The event raised a lot of money to support future Tollgate programs and staff.



One of PumpkinFest's challenges is dealing with the trash. PumpkinFest is a Saturday – Sunday affair, but the trash truck doesn't come until Tuesday. With 3,000 people on the site, the dumpster was full by the end of the day on Saturday. What's a Farm Manager to do?

Congratulations to the Nursery Team for another successful fall plant sale. Your teamwork and dedication to the nursery and fund raising is much appreciated. Likewise, kudos to the PAR team with a bountiful harvest for 2021 of 2,115 pounds of produce, all donated to battle food insecurity in our community. Many thanks to the AGL's and teams, individual garden members who continue to work into the last month of our gardening season to keep our education gardens beautiful and healthy! I was pleased and proud to see a good representation of Tollgate Garden Volunteer members assisting at the Pumpkinfest event. The interests and goals of gardeners and educators on the site are interwoven and it is important to encourage and support each other in our efforts. Thank you for your volunteer efforts at that event.

Renovation of the Rose Garden was initiated with Roy's help. The diseased plant material will be removed and soil levels brought back to initial planting levels. This previously spectacular centerpiece of the Tollgate gardens will be re-designed as a mixed planting bed with roses as the show stoppers.

Vote Now- October is the month to vote on all elected positions for TGAC. Though the field of nominees is very limited, we ask that you participate in the voting process – write-in votes are welcome! 2021 has been another unusual year in Tollgate's Nursery - but we are making progress back to "normal." We started the year with most of last year's restrictions remaining in place. The question of format, and even whether we would be able to host our traditional Spring Sale continued well into our planning and preparation window! But in the end, we did have a very successful sale!



With a lot of thinking and discussion, we created a plan that would restrict the number of shoppers in the nursery at one time - but still provide an opportunity for our loyal shoppers to participate. This required a 2-day Sale, held from 9 am until 2 pm on both Saturday and Sunday of the second weekend in June.

Shoppers were able to sign up online for 30-minute shopping appointments and we all worked to arrange placement of plants, signage and support staff so that it was easy for shoppers to quickly find and buy what they needed within their allotted time.

As summer wound down, the Fall Plant Sale returned to Nursery tradition - we were able to welcome shoppers to the nursery without requiring appointments or limiting attendance!



The fall sale is typically a smaller crowd, but we had a great turnout and enjoyed the opportunity to provide a good variety of healthy perennials at an affordable price! Historically, Tollgate Plant Sales provide a significant source of funding for the gardens. The Nursery Team is pleased that hosting both Spring and Fall sales this year generated over \$7,000 towards maintaining the gardens!

Other significant Nursery events in the Summer of 2021 include the installation of deer fence



around the entire trellis area of the Nursery. We also closed the Shade House, consolidating all our pots under the trellis nursery, a more efficient layout for us to maintain. The trellis area was equipped a few years ago with overhead sprinklers equipped with automatic timers for all rows except the outside rows on the east side of the nursery, on both sides of the center path. We hope to extend the overhead system to include this area in spring 2022. Then we will be able to rely on automated overhead irrigation for the entire nursery!

October's focus is on closing the nursery for the season. Taking a final fall inventory is not anyone's favorite chore - but completing this is essential to our planning process. The first use is to determine how many plants will need special overwintering protection to survive the typical Michigan winter in a pot. Although all the plants we stock are hardy in our zone. Michigan's constant winter freeze/thaw cycle makes life even more difficult for plants in a pot! We will use our inventory counts to identify which plants will need special winter handling to deal with these typical Michigan winter conditions. These pots will spend the winter grouped together under a row cover, with some perhaps stored in the nursery shed! This treatment protects plants from excess moisture (rain and snow melt) while providing some extra insulation to moderate the freeze/thaw cycle. Unfortunately, a wet spring may still cause damage to these pots, but we can't control Mother Nature! The fall inventory counts will also be used next spring to identify which plants we need to stock up for the spring sale. This PLANTS WANTED list will be sent out to all of you next spring, with the hope that some of you have these plants in your home gardens to divide and bring to the Nursery!

Working in the NURSERY is a unique gardening experience! It provides an opportunity to learn about lots of different types of plants, as well how to maintain healthy perennials in a pot – and generate support for all the Tollgate Gardens. Fall is here, the breeze is cool, and the harvest has reached an end, but a glorious end – 2115 lbs. in total! The volunteers have been tireless and awe inspiring with their dedication and persistence, even as the potato beetles and weeds seemed to be gaining the upper hand. In the end, the PAR Garden volunteers won the war with the following results:

Over 1000 lbs. more than 2020, and we have plans to address challenges and pest issues for an even better yield next year.







Our final efforts were focused on harvesting the second plantings of beets and carrots, the last of the beans, and the remaining winter squash the latter of which is curing in the dry ventilated heat of the greenhouse.



The weather has been both a friend and a foe with the hot humid wet conditions increasing the growth of our plants and hastening the ripening of the vegetables, but also contributing to weed and pest problems, and rot, so we did have a fair amount of waste. We will be rotating crops based on crop types and pest/disease issues, moving the bean trellis, raising the beds for better irrigation and drainage, and covering the entire garden with black plastic to discourage weed growth. We will also have some fun with a flame thrower to help with adult potato beetle emergence, plenty of row covers to protect the cabbage and potatoes from pests, as well as the addition of some companion planting for pest control and weed competition.

We had a great turn out for our planning meeting and have a crop inventory and plan ready for Spring planting.







But our work for the year is not yet completed we still need to renovate the garden beds and pathways, as well as plant garlic. A call for volunteers to help with the renovation has been issued for Saturday workdays in October -10/16, 10/23, and 10/30. All 35 beds need a soil / compost mix added and spread, the pathways need fresh wood chips, and it all needs to be covered with black plastic and secured for the winter. All of which I have

great confidence we will achieve!

It is both bitter and sweet to wind down the 2021 season, but wonderful to anticipate the upcoming 2022 season.

Eagle candidates and their volunteers build fences, create gardens, install paths, improve access to the farm, improve the maple syrup program, and help in many other ways. After over a year of absence due to Covid, Eagle candidates and their projects are returning to the farm.

One of the Eagle Projects being conducted this fall is an improvement to the sap holding capacity for the maple syrup making program. Eagle candidate, Trevor Perl, will be expanding the elevated platform to accommodate a second maple sap tank. Trevor and his crew recently set the posts for their project and plan to complete the platform in the next few weeks. The Tollgate cattle were very interested in the progress of the project.
