Members will have the opportunity to compete in a variety of project categories along with other 4-H members from Alpena County. As well as showcasing your 4-H project(s), you will be able to interview for a chance to win a scholarship that can be used towards the cost of 4-H Exploration Days or Summer Camp. Scholarship applications and an interview sign-up sheet will be available on Youth Day at the MSU Extension table. **New this year—In order to be eligible to receive a scholarship at Youth Day you MUST actively participate in Youth Day. NEW!!!***Market Sale Club***

New this year, all 4-H members marketing an animal will be required to join the Alpena County 4-H market club. This club does not replace your regular 4-H club. You must still participate in your regular 4-H club as well as the market club. In 2015 there will be (5) market club meetings. In order to be eligible to market an animal, 4-H members will be required to attend at least (3) of the (5) meetings. The market club will be a 4-H member run club. The first meeting will have officer elections—president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer. The purpose of a market club is to discuss market sale rules, proper show techniques, pen displays, thank you cards for buyers, and more. If you have any questions please contact Helen-Ann.

- Earliest Birth: December 8, 2013 (max age 20 months at fair)
- *Must be purchased by December 31, 2015
- *Must be tagged & filed at MSUE office by January 1

Feeder Calf

- Earliest Birth: January 8, 2015 (max age 6 months at fair)
- *Must be purchased by spring weigh-in
- *Must be tagged & filed at MSUE office by June 1

Veal

- Suggested Birth: April 15–May 10, 2015 (age 14-18 weeks at fair)
- *Must be raised on cow (not pasture) or with milk replacer (no grain, hay or grass)
- *Must be tagged & filed at MSUE office by June 1

Goat

- Earliest Birth: January 1, 2015
- *Must be purchased by spring weigh-in

Lamb

- Purchase by April 15, 2015 (Must be born after Jan 1, 2015)
- *Must be weighed at spring weigh-in in order to be eligible to market

Swine

- Suggested Birth: February 1-March 31, 2015
- *Must be purchased by spring weigh-in

Small Market Animals:**Turkeys/Geese**

- Earliest Hatch: February 22, 2015 (max age 24 weeks at fair)

Pheasant

- Earliest Hatch: April 19, 2015 (max age 16 weeks at fair)

Ducks

- Earliest Hatch: April 26, 2015 (max age 14 weeks at fair)

Rabbits

- Earliest Birth: May 17, 2015 (max age 12 weeks)

Quail

- Earliest Hatch: May 31, 2015 (max age 10 weeks at fair)

Chickens

- Earliest Hatch: June 21, 2015 (max age 7 weeks at fair)

Cornish Hens

- Earliest Hatch: July 12, 2015 (max age 4 weeks at fair)

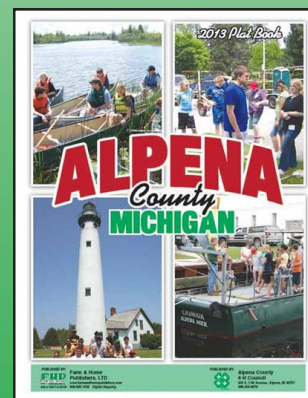


Alpena County 4-H Council Update

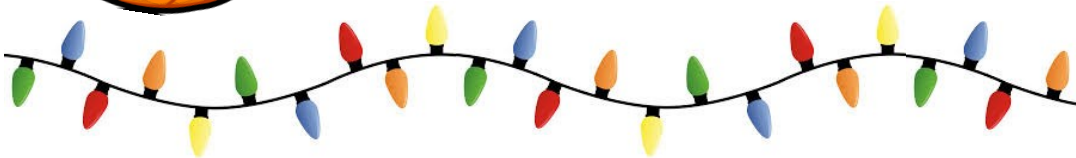

Spring Weigh-In—MAY 12, 2015

The spring weigh-in will take place at the Alpena County 4-H Market Club meeting on May 12, 2015. This date is later than past years, because we want to ensure the swine barn is clear of winter storage items. Animals that must be weighed include sheep and goats (optional). Goats are optional to be weighed; however, it is highly recommended to weigh them in so you have an idea of their beginning weight and so you can participate in the rate of gain contest. Sheep are required to be weighed in order to be eligible for the market sale. We will not have a swine weigh-in again this year due to recommendations from the MSU Extension swine unit. The necessary safety precautions that must be implemented to have a spring weigh-in with swine would be too strenuous to implement.

Snorkeling 101!

IMPORTANT HDC REMINDER

In order to be eligible to attend the 4-H State Horse Show on August 7-9, 2015 at the MSU Pavilion you must participate at the Alpena County 4-H Youth Day on March 14, 2015 and the Alpena County 4-H Horse Achievement Day (where state show qualifiers are determined) on June 14, 2014 at the Alpena fairgrounds.
