



REMINDER OF 2017-2018 4-H RE-ENROLLMENTS We are now six (6) months into the 2017-2018 4-H program year; in which the 4-H calendar year runs from September 1 through August 31 each year. <u>Deadline for</u> 4-H members and adult leaders to re-enroll was Friday, December 15, 2017. 4-H members and adult

leaders who have not re-enrolled for 2017-2018 will no longer be active in the file.

There are 41 youth who have enrolled in the 4HOnline system, but <u>HAVE NOT</u> paid the annual \$20 4-H participation fee. <u>NOTE - The annual \$20 4-H participation</u> <u>fee applies to all 4-H Cloverbuds and 4-H members ages 5 to 19</u>. Adult 4-H leaders are exempt. These youth will remain "PENDING" in the 4HOnline system until their participation fees have been paid.

For 4-H families with three or more youth, the annual 4-H participation fee cap is \$60. For your convenience a 2017-2018 Huron County 4-H Participation Fee Family worksheet can be found in this newsletter.

The annual 4-H participation fees <u>MUST</u> to be paid by 4:30 p.m. Monday, February 5, 2018, otherwise youth will be returned to "INACTIVE" for the 2017-18 4-H year.

<u>Checks are payable to "MSU</u>." <u>There is NO OPTION TO PAY ONLINE</u>. If you need assistance in covering the 4-H participation fee, please contact Patti Errer, 4-H Program Coordinator, at 989-269-9949, ext. 609.

<u>ONLY NEW</u> 4-H members have until Friday, June 1, 2018, to enroll in the 2017-2018 4-H program year in order to participate in the 2018 Huron Community Fair. <u>NO</u> 4-H enrollments will be accepted after the June 1st deadline; so any new members, wishing to join 4-H before fair, need to do it prior to June 1, 2018, or wait until September 1, 2018, when the new 2018-2019 4-H program year begins.

YOUTH PORK QUALITY ASSURANCE ROLL-OVER INFORMATION

For many years, the Youth Pork Quality Assurance (YPQA) Plus Program has been the core quality assurance certification program for youth who sell and exhibit their swine, including many Michigan 4-H'ers. In 2015, it was decided that the YPQA Plus program would be completely redesigned into an overarching, all-species quality assurance program known as the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) Program.

The intended final roll-out date for the YQCA program was January 2018, however, delays in the platform development led to an extension of the existing YPQA Plus program until June 1, 2018. Youth with a current YPQA Plus certification will remain certified until the expiration date has passed; there will not be an extension for youth certifications. YPQA Plus certifications, as well as YQCA certifications, will be accepted by and could be required by processors and certain fairs and livestock exhibitions.

4-H/FFA BUILDING SHOWCASES

In 2005, several showcases were replaced in the 4-H/FFA Building at the Fairgrounds. The monies to construct the showcases were raised or donated by 4-H Clubs either in honor of or in memory of community members.

There still remains some additional showcases that are falling apart, missing glass or don't work properly. The showcases are important because they keep the members' projects protected from damage and theft, and they also provide an organized structure for display and viewing. At the 2017 Huron Community Fair, 291 members exhibited 1,261 projects in the 4-H/FFA Building.

A grant has been written and received from the Huron County Youth Advisory Committee of the Huron Community Foundation for one new showcase. However, several more showcases are needed for the 2018 Huron Community Fair. The goal is to replace all the old showcases in the 4-H/FFA Building. Cost is approximately \$788 for one showcase.

ANTHONY L. RAPES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Several \$500 scholarships are awarded annually to Huron County's outstanding college-bound high school seniors through the Anthony L. Rapes Memorial Scholarship Fund. Since 1981, this scholarship has been awarded to several students each in memory of Tony Rapes, a long-time Extension Agricultural Agent in Huron County.

Criteria for scholarship awards include high moral character, initiative, and scholastic achievement, as well as outstanding achievements in 4-H and/or FFA. Students are eligible if they will be focusing on a major in agriculture or a related field. Applications are available at high school offices or stop by the MSU Extension Office.

Judging will take place the first full week in July and awards will be given out for 1st = \$75, 2nd = \$60, 3rd = \$50, 4th = \$40, and 5th = \$30.

Requirements are:

- 1. Billboard must be a minimum of 4 ft. x 8 ft.
- 2. Billboard must be made of a permanent material such as plywood.
- 3. Billboard must include name of the fair, dates and location of the fair.
- 4. Billboard must be posted in a prominent location in the county, and very visible by passing cars, by July 1, 2018. They must be positioned at least 33 ft. from the edge of the road on private property. Billboard must be taken down within two weeks of close of fair or award will not be paid.
- 5. Billboard will be judged on creativity, design and its effectiveness in promoting the fair (i.e. if its in a location where many people will see it).
- 6. 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters need to submit a billboard registration form for the contest at fair registration. Include the location of the billboard for judging.
- 7. Billboard registration forms will be available in the fair office at the fairgrounds.
- 8. Winners will be posted in the fair office during fair week and announced at opening ceremonies on Sunday, July 29, 2018.

The World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute is a life-changing experience coordinated by Michigan 4-H and Michigan State University where high school students engage with local leaders and experts on critical global challenges, participate in hands-on activities, and explore exciting ways to make a difference in Michigan and around the world. Students research issues they care about, and propose their ideas to solve these grand challenges.

The Michigan Youth Institute is hosted by Michigan State University with the generous support of the MSU College of Agriculture and Natural Resources, Michigan 4-H, Michigan State University Extension, Michigan FFA and the World Food Prize. Youth in grades 8-12 have the option of participating in the Michigan Youth Institute on May 10, 2018 on MSU's campus in East Lansing or at the Upper Peninsula Research and Extension Center in Chatham, MI.

The most outstanding youth who participate in the Michigan Youth Institute will be selected to represent Michigan as delegates to the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa (October 17-20, 2018). At the event, they will interact with Nobel and World Food Prize laureates and more than 1,000 global leaders from 75 countries attending the World Food Prize's annual international symposium. financial contributions of the World Food Prize Foundation and Michigan State University. Youth participants may also qualify to apply for scholarships and prestigious paid internships that will have them working side-by-side with leading food security researchers in the United States and around the world!

To participate in the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute, students write a 3 page paper by selecting a foreign country and researching one of 20 key factors affecting people and food security in that country

(examples of key factors include plant and animal science, water scarcity, climate volatility, sustainable agriculture and human rights). Newly revised and updated paper writing instructions, resources for conducting their research and writing their paper, and paper samples are available to youth on the World Food Prize website.

Between February 1 and April 1, youth submit their completed papers and register for the 2018 Michigan Youth Institute at <u>http://events.anr.msu.edu/wfpmiyi/</u> Teachers and adult mentors are encouraged to attend the Michigan Youth Institute



with their student/youth (they too must pre-register). The program is free for youth participants who are currently registered members of Michigan 4-H and for adult mentors/teachers. Youth not registered as Michigan 4-H members must pay a \$20 participation fee. Scholarships are available for youth upon request.

On May 10, in either East Lansing or Chatham, participating youth will:

• Present their research and recommendations on ways to solve key global challenges in a short speech and



small group discussions with statewide experts;

- Connect with other student leaders from across Michigan to share ideas, identify solutions to these problems and build lasting friendships;
- Explore the issues, current research and opportunities to make a difference at Michigan State University; and
- Interact with global leaders, innovators and entrepreneurs in Michigan working to end hunger and poverty and improve food security around the world.
