Dear 4-H Club Leaders and 4-H Parents,

The MSU Extension office has been informed that beginning September 1, 2017, changes will be occurring to the 4-H participation fee. The Michigan 4-H participation fee will be \$20 per youth or \$60 per family with 3 or more youth per year, whichever is LOWEST. Listed below are the explanations of the increase and benefits 4-H will receive.

Explanation

- This is the first increase in participation fees in more than 10 years.
- Funds generated will support both county and statewide programming efforts.
- ◆ Families with three or more children in 4-H will not pay over \$60 in annual participation fees.
- The rate will not increase/decrease based on date payment is made, involvement, age or county. It will not increase in 2018.
- This change is consistent with the direction of most other 4-H programs in the North Central Region.
- Michigan does not collect participation fees for parents or volunteers.
- ♦ Comparison of youth development organization charges such as: Boy Scouts \$24, Girl Scouts \$25, AAU Sports clubs \$14-30+ and Michigan 4-H \$20.

Benefits

- A full year of youth development programs on a county level. Youth can participate in as many clubs and project areas as they choose for the same low cost.
- ◆ Access to state and national 4-H programs and events such as 4-H Day at Breslin, 4-H Explorations Days, 4-H Capitol Experience, National 4-H Congress, Citizenship Washington Focus, state 4-H animal shows/expos, Kettunen Center workshops and more.
- Discounted registration rate for many local camps and statewide programs.
- Access to various 4-H scholarships and award opportunities throughout the state, including six \$10,000 scholarships given annually to 4-H alums attending MSU.
- County or clubs will no longer purchase accident insurance policies on an annual basis. With this fee increase, supplemental accident insurance coverage will be provided by American Income Life for all 4-H youth and volunteers enrolled in 4HOnline. This will be handled on a state level, saving counties this expense.
- In addition to saving county staff time spent on the Volunteer Selection Process, the centralized background checks will provide a more thorough screening process by working with a national background check vendor.

Youth who participate in any type of on-going or in-depth 4-H program are required to pay the fee.



<u>SLA Registration deadline is Monday, June 12th</u>. Forms can be turned in on June 12th from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Huron Expo Center or can be mailed to SLA Secretary, 8340 Polk Road, Minden City, MI 48456.

JLA members turned in their fair entry forms at the time of animal tagging and weighin. The annual \$5 administrative fee will be paid by the Junior Livestock Association to the Huron Community Fair. Fair passes for livestock exhibitors will be given out by the specie superintendents on Sunday, July 30, when animals are brought in.

All other youth (non 4-H, FFA, SLA or JLA members) will pay an annual \$15 administrative fee to the Huron Community Fair. Youth exhibiting still (non-livestock) projects who pay the annual \$5 administrative fee will receive a fair pass for the week of the fair.

Adults ages 20 or older can participate in the Adult Open Class and will pay an annual \$15 administrative fee to the Huron Community Fair when turning in their fair entry forms. (4-H leaders are exempt from this fee.)


