- (c) Days on feed is the number of days between date of beginning weight, and including the date of final weight.
- (d) 4-H tattoo number found in the rabbit's left ear.
- (e) Total weight gain is the difference between the final weight & the beginning weight.
- (f) Average daily gain is the total weight gain divided by the number of days on feed.
