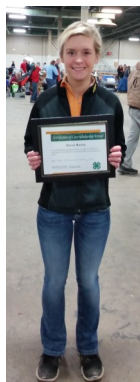

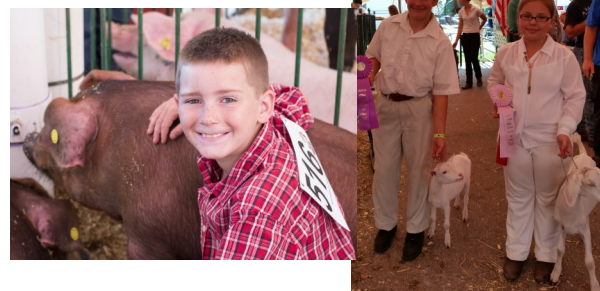


## 4-H Club Information

Lapeer County youth ages 5-19 can join one of many clubs located all over the county. **You do not need to own an animal** or live on a farm to join 4-H! We have many clubs that focus on non-animal projects, such as archery, shooting sports, crafts, sewing and fly fishing.

It only costs **\$20 per year** to join 4-H beginning September 1, 2017—even if you're a member of more than one club! Additional project supply costs may vary, depending on the club.

Clubs must meet a minimum of **6 times per year**. The schedule and meeting locations are set by each club.
