This newsletter is packed with information about the fair so take a very close look at all of the pages. It is emailed to all families in 4-H so you all should know exactly what is going on. I have included many important dates, as well.

I have already checked all fair registrations and cleaned those up so they are correct, with the wonderful help of Kim at the IFF office, or contacted those that are missing theirs. If you think you did yours incorrectly, I need to know ASAP. Parking passes can be picked up at the fair.

4-H Service Club Food Booth

Each club is required to work a shift at the 4-H Food Booth during the fair. During a shift, there must be at least 9 individuals that are older than 13 to work in the kitchen, 2 adults to work the cash register, and 2 youth to clean the dining area. We ask that there is no more than 1 rotation or replacements during the shift. Also, the individual working the cash register should work the entire shift.

This food booth raises money for 4-H members to attend workshops and events at reduced costs throughout the year. It also pays participation fees for

the families that are unable to.

If the 4-H member or family is involved in multiple clubs, it is expected that you work during each of your clubs'

shifts, unless your leader tells you they don't need you during one. Parents are also asked to help

during these shifts, especially when the club has many young members.

Please remember to drink water while you are working and to bring a hat. Each club should bring 8 -two crust baked fruit pies to their shift. **Please do**

not pre cut them or bring them early. Also, clubs need to bring 1 jar of

unsweetened iced tea and 1 can of coffee to their shift.

Awards

The winner must then write a thank you note to the sponsor and bring that to the fair 4-H office in a stamped and addressed envelope in order to get the plaque or chair. If you think that you are supposed to receive a special award but did not receive a card, please check with the 4-H office. I did have many plaques that were never picked up last year.

Sweepstakes

This show is for the top showman of each species in each age group. It is a great honor to participate in this show. Each youth (one junior, intermediate, and senior of each species) must show all 11 animals in a round-robin order on the

Participants use time during the fair to go around to other members from different projects to learn the different projects. There will also be "clinics" that 4-H members can go to where other members will teach them how to show. There will be a sign up for this at the 4-H office during the fair.

Record Books

Record books are a requirement every year for every animal project shown at the fair. This is an essential educational component of raising, training, showing, and selling an animal. Record books are due at different times for different species. Horse and dogs are due before fair to

the superintendent. Poultry, rabbits, and cavies are due at check in. All other animals are due to the 4-H office at the fairgrounds by 6pm Saturday, July 14. A 4-H member cannot show unless they have submitted a complete and neat record book.

Steve McLean 4-H Photography Contest



The Ionia Free Fair experience is an amazing one. Everyone takes many pictures to commemorate the experience so why not submit those pictures for a chance to win a prize! Here are the rules for the contestant:

- 1. Must be a 4-H member between the ages of 9 and 19 (4-H Age). The photo must be taken by the 4-H member. This means that the only way the photographer can be in the picture is if it's a selfie.
- 2. Must create their own caption to go along with the picture. The caption should be 25 words or less.
- 3. Must be original in color or black and white. You chose which best compliments the picture the best. Cropping is allowed but no other editing of the photo is acceptable.
- 4. If there are other people in the photo as the focus, you must have a signed permission form from them. This can be found at the 4-H Office at the fairgrounds.
- 5. Must attach a signed release for the use of the photograph to be used in promotion from the 4-H program and the Ionia Free Fair.
- 6. May enter one photo per theme, and as many themes as you like.
- 7. A winner will be chosen from each theme.
- 8. Any type of camera may be used, including mobile phones.
- 9. Be creative and candid!

To enter: All photos are due electronically by 11:59pm Saturday, July 21. Please send the photo in an email to mcleanha@anr.msu.edu with the signed releases and titled "Photo Contest: (the theme)." In the email include your name, age, and caption. Photographs will be judged by a panel of judges and winners will be announced in August. All photographs will also be posted on the Ionia County 4-H Facebook page to be viewed by the public.
