What is 4-H?

4-H is a learn-by-doing fun, educational program developed for youth. 4-H encourages well-rounded development in areas of knowledge, skill, citizenship, and leadership.

4-H is offered and funded by MSU Extension, United States Department of Agriculture, Michigan State University, and Tuscola County government.

What are the Advantages?

Boys and girls work together. Learning to work together as a team is a vital skill for the growth and development of youth. This helps them to be productive later in life for the work force.

With many ranges of projects, youth have a variety of interests that can be developed through the help of MSU Extension.

Caring adults and parent volunteers are given the opportunity to work interactively with youth in their community.

Who is 4-H For?

4-H serves youth members 5-19 years of age. MSU is an affirmative-action, equal-opportunity employer. Members pay an annual participation fee of \$10. This fee is used for the development of new 4-H programs at the local and state level. Some clubs also have small dues or fundraisers to help support their own activities.
