4H Teen Leadership Project Report

Teen Leader Definition: A teen leader is any 4-H member 12-19 years of age (as of January 1 of current project year) who is enrolled in the Teen Leadership project, and is actively participating in 4-H leadership activities

Leadership activities may include one or more of the following:

- Full or partial leadership of a specific project(s).
- Leadership involvement/responsibilities at the club level (including serving as an officer, serving on a committee(s) or assisting the club organizational leader with club organizational tasks).
- Leadership involvement/responsibilities at county and state level 4-H events and activities.
- Service on county and/or state level 4-H project developmental committees and/or program planning committees.

Note: The minimum project requirement for being a teen leader is that you carry out one or more leadership responsibilities within your project/community club that is above and beyond serving as a club officer. The number and level of leadership responsibilities should increase with each additional year served as a teen leader.
