## GREATER LAPEER ARBOR #785 OF GLEANER LIFE INSURANCE SOCIETY DONATES \$500 TO LAPEER COUNTY 4-H CAMP!

Lapeer County 4-H Camp Counselors are excited for summer and the upcoming 4-H Camp, held July 14-19, and one local organization gave them a head start in making this summer unforgettable for their young campers. As a part of "Join Hands Day", a national day of volunteering to bring youth and adults together in order to improve their communities, Greater Lapeer Arbor of Gleaner Life Insurance Society generously donated \$500 to Lapeer County 4-H Camp Counselors to make a difference in a program they hold near and dear to their hearts. "We are delighted to support Lapeer County 4-H,", says Cheryl Holland, Secretary of Greater Lapeer Arbor of Gleaner Life Insurance Society. With this grant, the camp counselors were able to purchase a new, large fire pit ring for Camp Lael as well as new life jackets that will benefit all youth attending this camp for years to come.

This past Saturday, May 10<sup>th</sup>, the counselors rolled up their sleeves and helped clean up the beach from the long winter. They were able to help prepare and improve the beach area, as well as the campfire area. They moved picnic tables; picked up branches downed from the winter storms around the beachfront, picnic and campfire area; raked under the picnic pavilion, around the campfire area and cleaned out the fire pit to prepare placement of the newly purchased fire pit ring. Next the counselors engaged in training for their roles as camp counselors and hosted an Open House in the afternoon for campers and their parents giving them a tour of the camp and answering questions they might have had.

Also, this Gleaner grant will be an annual program, so start thinking about a beautification project your club would like to do next year to utilize these funds in our community!
