



Nebraska 4-H Continuum of Youth Entrepreneurship Curricula

For youth to be able to return to their rural communities, they need a vision for how they will prosper and thrive, build and provide for their families and find success for their future. Research has shown that given those opportunities, many rural youth would like to return to their home communities.

The prevailing mindset for over the last half century has been that communities educate their youth so that they are able to go out into the world, and get a job. That mindset has resulted in many youth from rural places relocating to where they can build their careers, often not back to the community that invested in their education.

Entrepreneurship education offers youth a new mindset; that of getting a good education so that they are able to remain in their home communities, creating their own business

opportunities, and jobs for others as well. When rural youth embrace the entrepreneurial spirit, rural communities will begin to revitalize with new generations of businesses and younger population bases.




