

Introduction

This project book has been created specifically for 4-H members enrolled in the 4-H Cat Project. Keeping a record book is an important part of the project. It will help you set goals for the project year, record your accomplishments and help guide your efforts to keep important records on your cat(s) healthy and contented, know the cost involved in raising a cat, and become a responsible cat owner. In addition, project participants will practice important life skills such as decision-making, communicating with others, leading self and others, planning and organizing, and accepting responsibility.

Why Complete a Record Book?

A record book is a way for you to learn. Here are some important reasons why 4-H expects you to complete a 4-H record book for your project.

Keeping a 4-H record book will help you:

- Organize yourself
- Set reasonable goals
- Appreciate what you've learned this year
- Recognize what you've learned and track your progress from year to year
- Explain what you've learned
- Keep track of costs of your project
- Gather information needed to apply for awards and scholarships
- Complete applications and resumes
- Meet requirements to participate in some county, state and national 4-H events.

Guidelines for the Cat Project Record Book

- Exhibitors who are exhibiting a cat/kitten are <u>required</u> to complete a Cat Project Record Book. One record book can be completed for all of your project animals.
- 2. Start your record book at the beginning of the 4-H year (in September or when you join 4-H) and keep track of all your expenses and receipts during the year. It is important to update your record book monthly. Keep your book neat and complete.
- Exhibitors are to include clear photographs of project animal. Photos should be permanently mounted and labeled with the name of the exhibitor and cat/kitten. Additional pages may be added for pictures.
- 4. It is recommended that exhibitors include records books from the previous years to show improvement in the project area.
- 5. It is recommended that exhibitors put the Project Books in a notebook or binder to protect the pages. Plastic page protectors and dividers are acceptable, but are not mandatory.
- 6. Project books will be judged on neatness and completeness. Presentation may also be considered.




