4-H COUNTRY OR TOLE PAINTING

The following are guidelines for providing learning experiences in country or tole painting.

General Suggestions

- * Emphasize the relationship between the design used and the item it is used on.
- * More expertise should be evident as the years in the project increase.
- * Check out the library and museums for the origins and uses of tole painting.
- * Be able to explain to the judge the processes, techniques, brushes, tools, etc. it takes to make the project look like it does.

Beginners (1-2 years in project)

Suggested knowledge/skills to be learned:

- l. Cover basic materials.
- 2. Sponging and undercoating.
- 3. Care of brushes.
- 4. Preparation of articles to be painted.
- 5. Work with blending colors for realism.
- 6. Transferring the pattern.
- 7. Basic brush strokes coma, c strokes, floating dot flowers, etc.
- 8. Finishing.

Suggested projects for Beginners:

Any flat wooden surface object such as: wall plaque, tray, etc.

Intermediates (3-4 years in project)

Suggested knowledge/skills to be learned:

- 1. Continue using skills learned in previous years.
- 2. Work with striping.
- 3. Enlarging and reducing patterns.
- 4. Antique finish.
- 5. Experiment on other materials than wood.

Suggested projects for Intermediates:

An object other than wood, incorporating striping and border designs with basic design. Antiqued.

Advanced (5 years and over in project)

Suggested knowledge/skills to be learned:

- 1. Continue using skills learned in previous years.
- 2. More elaborate and refined work.
- 3. Work a repeated design to check uniformity in strokes.
- 4. Combine or create own designs or alter traditional designs.
- 5. Become a teen leader.

- Demonstrate a technique and/or develop instructional materials. Show and/or sell products at art shows, craft shows, etc. Explore career opportunities in arts and crafts. 6.

Suggested projects for Advanced: Tole painting on a piece of furniture or a curved object, any material.
