Wine Grapes

NW vineyards have progressed nicely due to moderate temperatures and many sunny days. The start of harvest for sparkling wines is fast approaching in commercial vineyards. Pinot Noir and Pinot Gris are around 20 brix at many sites.

The hybrids LaCrescent and Brianna and early viniferas Dornfelder and Madeleine Angevine were harvested from the research vineyard during the past week. The hybrid St. Croix and the vinifera Semillon will be ready this week.

Honey bees and the native Drosophila fruit fly have been very heavy on ripening fruit this fall, but yellow jackets are not as big of a problem as usual in NW vineyards. Bird depredation is troublesome where netting has not been deployed. Despite some botrytis rot and/or sour rot on injured clusters in a few vineyards, the overall condition of fruit still looks good.
