Protect your home

Provide 30 to 50 feet of defensible space around structures to prevent them from catching fire due to burning vegetation.

Use fire-resistant roofing such as asphalt shingles, metal roofing, and terra cotta tile. Avoid wood shake shingles.

Use fire-resistant landscape plants adjacent to homes and buildings.

Keep your lawn & landscape plants green and watered.

Prevent leaf litter from collecting on or under your deck, roof, eaves troughs and landscape plants.

Remove flammable materials from around foundation such as lumber, gasoline or paint.

Keep firewood stacks 30 to 50 feet from structures.

Maintain driveway width with 12 to 14 feet side-to-side clearance and 15 feet overhead clearance to allow fire and other emergency vehicle access.
