Recommended theme: Small-Scale Water Recreation

Crystal Lake Park

- Recommendations for this park include: • Install a roped-off swim area, a
- standing water slide, and an inflatable slide by the lake for summer
- Adding a kayak and canoe launch, concessions stand, and beach volleyball courts
- Add new amenities, such as outdoor workout equipment, restroom facilities, picnic tables, and bike parking
- Creating non-motorized connections through a bike path
