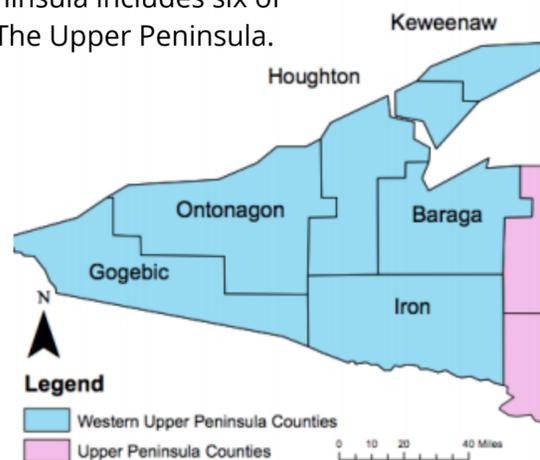

• Social Media

Key Findings



- About a quarter of all jobs in the Western Upper Peninsula are able to transition to remote work

- Total crime in the region is 42% below the national average.



- Unemployment rates in the Western Upper Peninsula have decreased from 2015 to 2019.



- Residents of the Western Upper Peninsula have a high rate of educational attainment.



- Local work opportunities create a sense of community and purpose, helping local people.
